LAST Week his Excellency General Schuylenbourg arrived here, and is to stay in the Lazaretto only 20 Days from the Day of his Arrival. On the 28th Instant arrived a Ship from Zara in 12 Days, which brings Advice that his Excellency Sebastian Mocenigo was come to Spalato from Castel Nuovo; also that the Captain of the Gulph Ant. Marin-Cavalli was returned to Zara with the Squadron of Gallies under his Command. Several Transport Ships are arrived in this Port from the Levant, with Troops, which are to make their Quarantain and then are to be sent to the Garrisons in the Terra firma. In a Ship from Zant is arrived here Sig. Carlo Pisani, Brother to the Captain General, and is gone this Day into the old Lazaretto. This Morning his Excellency Count Colorado the Emperour's Ambassadour, went to his Country-Seat in the Friuli, where he is to stay 10 Days, and then is to return to his Residence here. A Machine having been contrived by Sig. Schevran, for bringing the great Ships over the Shallows into this Arsenal, was this Week tried and approved; and he has had the Thanks of the Senate for this useful Invention, by which Ships of the second Rate are raised five Foot.

Rhinfels, Oct. 15. The Landgrave of Hesse Cassel having caused the Artillery and Stores which he had in this Fortress to be withdrawn, has sent Deputies to settle with those of the Princes of Rotenbourg, the Conditions of putting them into Possession of it. The Deputies of the said Princes refuse to accept this Place, till the Town of St. Goar and the County of Rhinfels are evacuated. They refuse to let their Garrison take an Oath (as formerly) to admit the Landgrave's Troops in Time of War, and suffer them to pass freely as often as his Highness shall require; and they insist upon the ordinary Contributions of the County, which amount to 1900 Crowns a Month, for maintaining the Garrison. The Deputies of the Landgrave have represented to them, that their Master cannot put this Fortress into the Hands of the Princes of Rotenbourg, unless their Troops take the usual Oath: That it being stipulated by the Convention made between the two Families in 1654, that the Landgrave of Hesse Cassel should allow a sufficient Sum for maintaining the Garrison of

Rhinfels, he was ready to grant for that Service 500 Crowns a Month: That as to the evacuating the Town of St. Goar and the County, their Master's Right to quarter his Troops in them had never been disputed; however, as the Evacuation of the County is expressly ordered by the Sentence of the Imperial Court, they have taken that Point *ad referendum*, and have sent an Express to the Landgrave for new Orders.

Copenhagen, Oct. 15. This Day we received Letters from Sir John Norris, dated from on board the Cumberland the 13th Instant, advising, that the Trade being not come from Dantzick, he had some Days before sent two Men of War to hasten them. There having since been strong Gales of Wind between the North and the West, it is believed all the Trade of England and Holland will take the Advantage of this Wind to come down the Baltick. Some Merchant Ships are already arrived, and we are expecting the rest. On the 12th Admiral Raben with the Danish Squadron left Bornholm, and is come into the Bay of Kiog. And as Sir John Norris will have Notice of the coming down of the Trade, he will soon leave Bornholm and return hither.

Hague, Oct. 21. On the 17th at Three in the Afternoon the Marquess de Prie and his Son arrived here, and alighting at the Earl of Cadogan's dined with him. The next Morning his Excellency had a long Conference with the Marquess: And Yesterday the latter had a Conference with the Deputies of the States General. He forbears taking on him the Character of Ambassadour and Plenipotentiary, till he signs the Convention relating to the Barrier-Treaty. The Tumults in the Province of Groninghen are suppressed: The 3000 Peasants who had taken Arms, were dispersed by a Detachment of 150 Men of regular Troops: They at first pretended to stand upon their Defence; but the Soldiers beginning to fire, they all fled. On the 14th Instant the States of the Province of Groninghen declared the young Prince of Nassau-Orange, who is about 8 Years of Age, their Stadholder and Captain-General, with all the Prerogatives which were enjoyed by his Predecessours. He was installed at Groninghen on the 15th, with all the Ceremonies usual on that Occasion, the Princess his Mother being present. The Emperour's Minister, Baron Heëms, having Information given him, that the Spniards were treating at Amsterdam for the building and
