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*Truroe, April 24.*

**H**ere is arrived the *Hopewell* of *London* in eleven weeks from *Jamaica*, which Colony they left in a very good and healthy condition, and the people there in dayly expectation of the return of the Fleet of Privateers, which some time since sailed from thence.

*Plymouth, April 25.* This day according to His Majesties Order, were shipt on board the *Reserve* *Fregat*, two Companies of Foot of this Garrison for the River of *Thames*; this evening the *Loyal Merchant*, and the *Ann* from the *East Indies*, are under sayl for *London*.

*Venice, April 18. N. S.* Some Vessels arriving here from *Zant*, with Letters from the *Proveditor General*, we understand, that he had happily concluded the affair of exchanging the Prisoners taken during the late Wars with the *Turks*, and that the Fleet under his command, was in a very good condition; so that having in a manner nothing more to do in those parts, it is said, this Senate will easily give him leave to return hither.

This Republick having ordered a Squadron of their men of war, to continue still cruising near *Sapientia*; we have not heard of any dammage the *Pyrates* have of late done in those Seas. It is said, that the Gallies of *Malta* have not long since taken several Merchant ships belonging to the *Turks*, which we very much fear may provoke the Port, and prove of bad consequence to that State.

By Letters from the Port we are assured, that the Grand Seignor is fully resolved to pass very suddainly with all the Forces he hath at present on foot in those parts, into *Asia*; to which his Physicians, as well as the Grand Visier and other Ministers at present advise him; though upon different accounts; yet some speak as if he would first go to *Constantinople*; to celebrate the Circumcision of his Son; for though the Sultaneis in the mean time stands with her party on her guard, and is sufficiently watchful to prevent any surprize, yet seems she willing to have this solemnity kept there.

The Senate having amongst other things this week made choice of Procurator *Nani*, a person, who for his great worth and abilities, hath gained a most particular respect and esteem amongst all people here, to be their Commissioner in *Dalmatia*, to treat with those appointed by the Port, for the adjusting the matter of the Limits; They have likewise resolved upon the demand lately made by the *Turks*, of some places at present in the possession of this State, to insist onely upon holding those Territories which are depending on, and under the jurisdictions of those Castles and Places, which during the late War they took from the *Turks*, and to leave the other open and wasted Country, in the condition it was in before, by which means they will likewise quit *Rissano* to the *Turks*.

Cavaliere *Grimaldi* is ordered by this Senate to execute the place of General *di Battaglia* in *Dalmatia*, to the disappointment of some other who expected that command. Captain General *Moro-*

*fini* having finally with much honour and gallantry acquitted himself, of those things some had accused him with; Yesterday, the day after his acquittal, appeared publickly in the Piazza of *St. Mark*, where he received the solemn congratulations of all the Nobility, as well of the first as second degree; after which all the Officers of the Army, who had served under him in *Candia*, waited upon him, and by Colonel *Annand* an *English* man, who hath for several years continued with great repute in the service of this State, expressed the joy and satisfaction they received in the good success of his affairs.

*Francfort, April 15.* The 12th instant, the young Electoral Prince *Palatine* began his journey, so long spoken of, towards *Holland*, *Denmark*; and those other Northern parts, having been accompanied by the Prince Elector his Father as far as *Mihheim*; the 13th he lodged at *Umsbade*; and yesterday morning came hither, and this morning he is parted again towards *Wessel*; it is said, he will spend most of this Summer in his Travels; and about Autumn return by *Denmark*, to consummate his Marriage with one of that Kings Sisters.

We are very much eased of the apprehensions we had, of the approach of some French Forces into the County of *Falkenstein*; having understood that they came onely to raise Contribution money of those Inhabitants, and are since retired again; but it is certainly said, that the *Maréchal de Crequi* was himself in person within few miles of *Worms*.

*Dantzick, April 24.* From *Warsaw* they write, that they received dayly fresh alarms from the Frontiers of the *Ukraine*, that *Dorofensko* being joined with a considerable Body of *Turks* and *Tatars*, gives great reason to suspect some ill design he hath in hand against this Kingdom; upon which the King hath ordered large supplies of men and provisions to be sent to *Caminiec*, a fortress of great importance on those Confines; upon which we have sufficient cause to apprehend they may make some suddain attempt. And for the better security of the Kingdom against any surprize, his Majesty hath issued out his General Letters to the respective *Palatinats*, requiring them to be watchful for their safety in these jealous times, and to be ready immediately upon the first summons, to come armed into the field, to oppose all the attempts and designs of their enemies; they farther add, that the King intends very shortly to go into the field himself, and to march with the Forces they have at present on foot, towards the *Ukraine*, to endeavor to settle things there, before they break out into a flame, in order to which, his Majesty hath appointed a grand Council of War to be held on the 14th of the next month, where they will accordingly take their measures how to proceed.
