Corunna, November 12.

N the 10th Inftant came into this Port a fmall Veffel with French Colours, carrying eight Guns and 40 Men: She is moftly manned with Scots, Irifh and Englifh, and in her came the Lord Duffus pretending to be a Merchant and to be bound for Cadiz. The Ship is preparing to clean, and on Inquiry proves to have a Swedifh Commiffion. The faid Lord remains incognito, and now gives out that he will go to Madrid and fend the Ship to Cadiz.

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Lisbon, Dec. 5. We have Advice from Spain the 25th of last Month, that a Perfon was arrived at the Pardo, who paffed for a Nobleman of Lorrain by the Name of the Count d'Edi-cour, but was believed to be the late Duke of Ormond. These Letters add, that the Troops which were fent against the Biscayners had been received into Bilbao, having not met with any Opposition from the People of the Country; but that fome of the Pealants which had occasioned the late Tumults, had retired to the Mountains. We have an Account from Cadiz of the Arrival of two Ships, the one from the Havana laden with Tobacco, the other from Vera Cruz richly laden with Cocheneal and other Goods, besides 400000 Pieces of Eight. On the 29th paft arrived here the Fleet from the Bahia in Brafil, bringing near 7000 Chefts of Sugar, 16000 Rolls of Tobacco, 21000 Hydes, 17 Arobas of Gold in Duft and Bars, 124000 Moedas; this is registred, 'tis reckoned there is much more Gold unregistred.

Naples, Dec 3. We have Advice by a Bark that is come in from Melazzo, that the Men of War and Transports having the Imperial Troops on Board, which came hither from Genoa, but last from Leghorne, and failed from hence on the 25th pass, were in Sight of Melazzo on the 26th with a fair Wind.

Genoa, Dec. 10. Notwithstanding the Rumours which have been industriously fpread for fome Time, that the Spaniards were preparing a numerous Convoy of Men of War and Transports at Barcelona, to carry confiderable Stores of all forts, and a ftrong Reinforcement of Troops, to Sicily or to Sardinia; we had an Account by a Bark that came from Barcelona on the 17th past, and arrived here on the 6th Inftant, that the Spaniards have not fent any Supplies or Troops either to Sardinia or Sicily, and that there were not any Transports in that Port. On the 9th arrived here the Loo, a British Man of War, Captain Protheroe Commander, who having looked into the Ports of Barcelona and Cagliari, and got good Intelligence at both Places, relates, that the Spaniards have not fent any Convoy to Sicily or Sardinia, and that there are not any Transports in either of the faid Ports. The British Men of War Superbe and Lenox came to an Anchor in this Road the 6th, and are fince failed again to cruize. We have Advice that the Spaniards have but 1800 Men on the Island of Sardinia. Letters from Milan fay the three Imperial Regiments of Foot of Wurtemberg, Holftein, and Traun, are ordered to march to Naples through the Ecclefiastical State.

Berne, Dec. 14. On the Ath Inflant died M. Willading, one of the two Avoyers or Heads of this Canton, and was buried on the 8th Inflant in the Morning with the ufual Solemnity. Though he was in his 79th Year, he was fo able a Magistrate, and in fo great Gredit, that this Republick has had a confiderable Lofs in him. It was by his wife and fleady Measures that the late Peace with the Abbot of St. Gall was brought about, and without his unwearied Diligence and conflant Efforts it would in all Likelihood have ftill been far off. M. Frishing his Collegue, having passed his 80th Year, has kept his Bed for fome Weeks, by reason of a Fall as he was going home from the Senate-House, and confidering his great Age 'tis much doubted whether he will ever

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be in a Condition again to perform the Functions of his Office. He is likewife a Person of distinguished Virtue, Courage, and Ability; and his Lofs will be as fensibly regretted by this State, as that of the former : It was under his Conduct the little Army of Berne gained fo compleat a Victory over that of the five Roman Catholick Cantons, which was more than double in Numbers, in the Year 1712. Since the Death of M. Willading, the Soveraign Council has made Choice of M. Steiguer, ancient Treafurer of this Canton, to be Avoyer in his Room.

Copenhagen, Dec. 6. A Number of Tranfports having taken on Board two Battallions here, failed the 3d Inftant, and took in another Battallion at Elfinore : They are to receive another Battallion at Flattrand in Jutland, and to proceed with all Expedition to Norway: But they are detained in the Sound by contrary Winds. We have no farther Accounts yet from Norway: Deferters from 'Schonen agree, that almost all the Swedifh Troops are marched towards that Kingdom; that all Provisions are at exorbitant Prices in Sweden, and the Country under great Mifery. The King -of Denmark returned hither Yesterday from Fredericksburg, and the fame Day the Prince Royal fat in Council for the first Time.

Paris, Dec. 21. Letters from Madrid of the 5th of this Month relate, That the Duke of St. Aignan had deferred his Journey till the 9th. That Count Lascaris set out for Turin the 2d. That on the 4th at Night the young Princes came to Madrid from the Pardo, but the King's coming thither was uncertain, becaufe his Indisposition continued, and the Doctors were apprehenfive his Removing might increafe his Fever, which by its Malignancy had weakened him very much ; befides his Legs were extremely fivelied, and an Ulcer had appeared in his Right Ham. That the King's Declaration in favour of the French Merchants in his Dominions had not had the Effect the Coure had promifed themfelves, it being advifed from Valencia, that notwith-ftanding the ftrong Affurances given them in the King's Name that in Cafe of a Rupture their Persons and Effects should be fafe, they would not venture to proceed in their Commerce. That by Letters from Catalonia it was advised, that the Peafants had laid a Confpiracy to cut off the Troops which are canton-ed in the Plain of Wich, but the Commander having received timely Notice, they were prevented, and three Perfons of Note with a Canon of the Church were banished on Sufpicion of being in the Number of the Conspirators. Or-

ders were fent from Madrid to Cadiz, for difpatching the Flota to New Spain early in the Spring. 'Tis advised from Rome, that Cardinal Giudice, Brother of the Prince de Cellamare, having made his Peace with the Imperial Court, was preparing to go to Vienna.
