VIVE British Ships of War, which were fent in August to Port-Mahon to careen, arrived here on the 12th Instant, and Sir George Byng has fince caused them to put to Sea, with Orders to cruise in proper Stations on the Coast of Sicily, to prevent the coming of Succours to the Spaniards. On the 11th Instant, the remaining Part of the Transports with 2000 Germans from Genoa, arrived here: By contrary Winds and Weather they had been detained so long, in their Passage, that they wanted Provisions and Water; but having been supplied with all Refreshments, Sir George Byng appointed a Convoy to go with them for Melazzo, and they failed the Noth at Night; but to Day we received an Account, that they are put back by contrary Winds to Baia. On the 19th arrived General Wachtendonck from Melazzo, to confer with the Viceroy on the State of Affairs at that Place.

Berne, Jan. 41 M. Hogguer of St. Gall having been appointed by the King of Sweden, to be his Resident with the Protestant Cantons, has presented his Credential Letters to the Canton of Zufich, which have been communicated to this State, and to the rest of the Protestant Cantons; and has acquainted them, that he will reside at Copet in the Pais de Vaud. Whereupon our Soveraign Council having assembled, a Letter has been ordered to be written to that Minister, returning him the Compliments while on such Occasions. On the 1st

Instant and the two following Days, a Jubilee was celebrated in all the Churches of the Canton of Zurich, in Commes moration of the Reformation, which was introduced there at the Beginning of the Year. 1519. Some Days ago General Diesbach, who is in the Emperour's Service, passed through this Place for Fribourg, whence he is to go to Milan, and to brick the Ecclehastical State to Naples. Detachments from the Garrisons of Brisac and Fribourg, are on the March through the Country of the Grisons for Italy.

Hague, Jan. 10. This Morning the Deputies of the Province of Frisaland have received Instructions from their Principals to acceed to the Quadruple Alliance. The States General wrote a Letter to Day to the States of Utrecht and Zeland, exhorting their earnestly to give their Consent to the said Accession. There being positive Advice come to their High Mightinesses by the last Post from Madrid, that the late Duke of Ormond was at the Court of Spain, the Marques de Beretti Landi had Yesterday a Conse

rence with their Deputies, in which he owned that indeed he had been at Madrid, but that the King his Master had ordered him to retire into the Country at a great Distance from Court. General Murray, Governour of Tournay, died there some Days ago: The States have nominated Major-General Rechteren to succeed him. 'Tis advised, that the Emperour has appointed Count Freydag to come hither in the Quality of his Envoy Extraordinary, in the Room of the late Baron Heems.

Paris, Jan. II. On the 7th Instant we received Advice from Luneville, that the Duke of Lorrain's Palace there had been burnt down in the Night, hardly any of the Furniture being saved. The Duke and Dutchess with their Children were there, and had but just time to save themselves. The Preparations for the War against Spain are carried on with great Diligence. The Duke of Orleans has received from the Count de la Mark, an Account of the Death of the King of Sweden. Letters from Madrid say, the King of Spain is on the mending Hand. We have Advice from Milan, that Prince Lewenstein Governour of that Dutchy, wied where on the 26th past.
