HE Court arrived here from Adrianople about three Weeks ago, to the great Satisfaction of the Inhabitants of this City, who suffered much by its Absence. A Druggerman from Poland, who arrived at Adrianople some time ago, followed the Court hither, and took upon him the Character of Conful; but as the Port has never yet allowed the King of Poland to keep any publick Person here in constant Residence, they have fent him away again, and the rather because he demanded to be defrayed by the Grand Signior. It was formerly advised from hence, that the Waywod of Walachia, who was taken Prisoner by the Germane in the late War, was promised to beg reinstated in that Principality; but since that, his Brother, who officiated in his Room during his Imprisonment, has by his Intrigues gov himself confirmed. The Dutch Ambas Tadour arrived here from Passarowitz some Weeks ago. The Turkish Fleet is come inta Port.

Venice, Jan. 14. On the 8th Instant arrived here the two Men of War called the Triumph and Madonna della Salute, commanded by the Captain Extraordinary of the Fleet Sig. Diedo, who has been very ill of a Fever, but is in a Way of Recovery. He is gone with all his Domesticks, Officers and Passengers, to the old Lazaretto, to perform Quarantain; the Corps of the late Captain General Pisani is also deposited there for the present. On the 10th Instant in the Morning was performed in the Church of Madonna della Salute, the Ceremony of Officing to the blessed Virgin, and hanging up near the High Altar, a Turkish Standard and Horse-Tail, given by the Family of Pisani to that Church. The same Morning the Carnaval was opened by Order of the Senate, in the usual Manner, the carrying of Arms privately being forbidden under the most rigorous Penalties. About 10ph Soldiers, Grisons and Swiss, who had performed Quarantain at the Lido, were Yesterday em.

barked to be transported to Verona, where they will be disbanded and fent home. Oa the 8th Instant General Schuylemburg went from hence to view the Gerrisons of Verona and Brescia; and after he has made a Reform among the Cavalry, he is to return hither about the End of this Month. It is advised from Corfu, that by Order from honce the Intendant of the Magazines there has been put under Arreit, for Fraude committed in the Discharge of his Office; also four Captains of Men of War there are pur under Confinement, for having clandestinely fold the publick Stores. Last Sunday Evening an Earth-quake was felt in this City, by which fome Chimneys were thrown down, but no other Damage was done: The Shuck was most felt at the Opera and Play-House, where the Performers and Actors let fall the Curtains, and the Company ran out. We have fince Advice from Friuli, that the Earthquake was more violent there than in other Barts, having thrown down several Churches and Houses,
