

roni, lately communicated by the same Mar-  
 quess to their High Mightinesses, protesting  
 that the Court of Madrid knew nothing of  
 the late Duke of Ormond's coming into Spain  
 till he was arrived in that Kingdom; and  
 declaring that his Catholick Majesty had or-  
 dered him to keep at 40 Leagues Distance  
 from his Court; when by an intercepted Let-  
 ter from that Cardinal to the Prince de Cel-  
 lamare, it is known the said late Duke was  
 invited to Madrid, in order to be employed  
 in an Enterprize; is also treated here with  
 the Regard due to such extraordinary Pro-  
 ceedings. The States have nominated M. de  
 Bye, who was lately recalled from Muscovy,  
 to go to Stockholm, but without any Cha-  
 racter, and he sets out to Morrow. Letters  
 from Gottenbourg of the 16th Instant give  
 an Account, that the Princess Ulrica-Eleanora  
 had been proclaimed Queen of Sweden; and  
 that a Proclamation had been published in  
 her Name dated the 15th of December, or-  
 dering a General Assembly of the States of  
 the Kingdom to meet on the 20th of Janu-  
 ary, O. S. and sitting forth, That her Maje-  
 sty had taken Possession of the Throne,  
 which on the Death of her Brother the late  
 King, became her's by Right of Inheritance:  
 That in the Administration of the Govern-  
 ment, she had firmly determined, out of  
 Regard to the Welfare and Prosperity of  
 the Kingdom, to reform all Innovations,  
 and entirely to abolish absolute and despo-  
 tick Power, which by this Proclamation she de-  
 clares she renounces for ever for her self and  
 Successors; and that she will re-establish the  
 Government in that ancient Form it happily  
 enjoyed in former Times. Some Advices say  
 the Duke of Holstein attempting to retire to  
 the Czar, had been stopped, and put under  
 Confinement at Stockholm. We have Advice  
 from Berlin, that the Queen of Prussia is  
 brought to bed of a Princess.
