HE Sovereign Council of this State having appointed Commissioners to examine the Grievances complained of by the Deputies of Neufchatel, frequent Confe-rences are held between them. The faid Deputies of Neufchatel have caused their Treaty of Comburghership with this Canton to be printed and distributed amongst the Members of this Republick. Yesterday the Sovereign Council was assembled upon the Accident which happened lately between M. de Wattewiller and M. Muller; wherein the latter was killed. The former was summoned twice publickly at the great Stairs of the Town-house, by an Officer of the State, to appear and to bring in his Defence against the Process formed against him by the Attorney General of this Canton for the Loss of a Subject. The same Ceremony will be observed once more within three Weeks, after which Sentence of Death will be pronounced against him for Contumacy.

Stockholm, Jan. 61 O.S. On Friday the 5th of December an Express arrived here from the Hereditary Prince of Hesse, with Letters for the Princes Royal his Consort, giving her an Account that the King her Brother was killed the Sunday Night before. Her Royal Highness immediately called together such of the Senators as were in Town, and a Resolution passed to take into Custody Count Vandernatis, which was done. At the same Time his House was fecured, as was also that of Baron Goertza and their Papers sealed up. That Evening Secretary Ecklehof, Counsellour Haagen, and M. Royer, Master of the Mint, were seized, and the Mint secured by Guards. An Officer was also dispatched to Aland, to seize Secre tary Stambke and all his Papers. On the 6th the Senate affembled, and resolved to pro-claim her Royal Highness Queen: The same Evening the Senate in a Body, and all the great Officers of the Crowh, we're admitted to

had the Honour to kiss her Hand. On the 7th, Being Sunday, the Death of the Kings and the Aucestion of the Queen to the Crowns was declared in all the Churches. that Declaration a focond Express from the Prince of Hesse brought an Account, that all the Army had proclaimed the Princels Queen, and that Baron Goertz being arrived near Swomstate, had been seized by Collonel Baumgartent Oh the 8th M. Rumpff, Refident of the States General, whom the late King had for some Time refused to admit to his Court or Presence in that Character, went to Count Hoorn, and defired him to procure him an Audience of the Queen. The Count affured him, that having refumed the Management of Foreign Affairs, he would endeavour with all possible Zeal to re establish good intelligence between her Majesty and their High Mightinesses, and to remove all Obstacles, which had interrupted the Commerce of the Sub! jects of both Nations.1 And a few Hours af? ter, the faid Resident received a Message from the Queen, fignifying! that underftanding he defired an Audience of her, to make his Com? pliments of Condoleance and Congratulation, her Majesty had refolved to grant it him at foon as her Aparements were hung with Mourning, affuring him at the fame Time of her firm Resolution to live in Harmony and firich Union with the States General. On the 15th her Majefty's Letters of Summons to the States of the Kingdom were published, appointing a General Adembly to be held on the zoth of The Coronation is to be at Uplal Tanuary. the 20th of February, O. S. Her Majesty had made Seven new Senators, viz. the Generals Taube, Ducker, Sparre, de la Gardie, Oernstedt, the Barons Bonde and Banier. The Prince of Helle is now filed his Royal Highness. In the Publick Prayers in all the Churches the following Terms are now used; For her Majesty the Queen, for her Consort his Royal Highness the Hereditary Prince of Hesse, and for all the Royal Family. On the 21st of December Ma-jor-General Bennet arrived here, having been make their Compliments to her Majesty, and I sent by the Generals of the Army to make

the Compliments of Condoleance and Congratulation to her Majesty in the Name of them all. Baton Goertz having been brought hither under a strong Guard, is kept in close Confinement. Her Majesty has given a special Commission for examining and trying the said Baron, upon leveral Articles whereof he is accused, both in relation to his foreign Negotiztions, and to his Administration of do mestick Affairs in this Kingdom. The late King's Corpse is deposited in the Palace of Cariberg, till the Preparations which are ma-

king for his Funeral are ready.

Hague, Feb. 7. The Draughts of the Instruments, containing the Articles of the Accel-tion of the States General to the Quadruple Alliance, having been prepared by the Greffier Fagel, were examined Yesterday in a Conference between the British and French Ministers and the Deputies of the States, and being fully settled, the Report was made and agreed to this Morning in the Affembly of the States General, and the same were fent this Evening to M. van Borfele, with Full Powers for him to figo the Treaties at London. On the 4th Instant the Council of State presented the Estimates of War for the Year 1749, to the States General in their Assembly, and Copies are preparing to be fent to the several Pro vinces. On the th M. de Bye fet out for Stockholm;

Hague, Feb. 10. In our Advices of the 31ft past it was related, that the Marquels de Beretti Landi, Ambastador of Spain, had in the Name of his Master notified to M. Nordwyck, the President for the Week of the Assembly of the States General, that if Prince Cellamare had engaged in any Conspiracy for exciting a Rebellion in France, it was absolutely without his Catholick Majesty's Knowledge or Directions: This was the Substance of the Report made by M. Nordwyck that Morning in the Assembly of the States. But the Amhaffadour being ivformed of it, has expressed the greatest Uneasinels and Concern at this Milrepresentation of his Conference 3 and the said Report which was entered on the Journal of the States, has sinder been altered, on his Instances, in Conformity to his Instances, in Conformity to his Instructions; which he now says were to declare. That the King of Spain had no Design on the Crown of France, nor to overthrow the Treatics of Utrecht 5 but that every thing the Prince of Cellamare had other. wise done was by Order, not to raise a Se-

dition, but in a View of affembling the States of France, and of delivering that Kingdom from the present Oppression under which it suffers. The States of the Province of Holland are to assemble here on the 15th Instant, to take into Consideration the Estimates and, Establishment of War for the current Year; upon which the other Provinces are also to deliberate, the States General having communicated Copies of that Establishment to each.
