1. Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Brent propose to make the above-mentioned Orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by section 8 of and Part I of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985, the Parking Acts of 1986 and 1989 and the Road Traffic Act 1991.

2. The general effect of the "Parking Places Orders" would be to increase the length of time permitted in short stay parking places and increase or reduce the length of carriageway available for existing pay and display and resident parking places in Algernon Road, Brondesbury Road, Brondesbury Villas, Donaldson Road, Granville Road, Hartland Road, Hazelmere Road, Honiton Road, Lynton Road, Victoria Mews, Victoria Road and Woodville Road.

3. The general effect of the Waiting and Loading Restriction Order would be further to amend the Brent (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1979, so that:

(a) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) would be prohibited at any time in certain lengths of Algernon Road, Brondesbury Villas and Victoria Mews;

(b) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) would be prohibited between 8.30 am to 6.30 pm on Monday to Fridays inclusive in certain lengths of Algernon Road, Brondesbury Road, Brondesbury Villas, Donaldson Road, Hartland Road, Hazelmere Road, Honiton Road, Lynton Road, Victoria Mews, Victoria Road and Woodville Road;

(c) waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle for a period of more than 20 minutes in the same place would now be prohibited:

(i) between 11.00 am and 6.30 pm throughout the week in the lengths of streets specified in paragraph 3(a) above to this notice;

(ii) between 11.00 am and 6.30 pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in the lengths of streets specified in paragraph 3(b) above to this notice;

(d) the sale or offer for sale of goods from a vehicle would be prohibited (except on Sundays in the lengths of streets specified in paragraph 3(a) unless there is in force a valid licence issued by the Brent Borough Council or the goods are immediately taken into or delivered at premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected;

(e) the use of any vehicle or of any animal or the wearing of fancy dress or other costume, wholly or mainly for the purpose of advertising would be prohibited;

(f) any existing prohibition on the waiting by vehicles, the sale or offer for sale of goods from a vehicle or the use of any animal or the wearing of fancy dress or other costume wholly or mainly for the purpose of advertising in certain lengths of the streets specified in paragraphs 3(a) and 3(b) above to this notice, would be revoked.

4. The general effect of the "Doctor Parking Places" Order would be to revoke the Doctor parking place in Brondesbury Road.

5. A copy of each of the proposed Orders, of relevant Orders of 1974, 1979, 2000, 2001 and 2002 (and of the Orders which have amended those Orders), of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Orders and of a map which indicates each length of road to which the Orders relate can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the expiration of a period of 21 days from the date on which this notice is published at:

London Borough of Brent**THE BRENT (PARKING PLACES) (NO 1) ORDER 2004****THE BRENT (WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTION) (AMENDMENT NO 162) ORDER 2004****QUEENSBURY STATION PARADE CPZ—(QA ZONE)**

1. Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Brent on 12 January 2004 made the above-mentioned Orders under sections 6, 45, 46, 49 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by section 8 of and Part 1 of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985, the Parking Acts of 1986 and 1989 and the Road Traffic Act 1991.

2. The general effect of the "Parking Places" Order will be to:

(a) designate parking places that will operate between 10.00 am and 3.00 pm on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in certain lengths of the streets specified in Schedules 1, 2 and 3 to this notice;

(b) specify that:

(i) each parking place may be used, subject to the provisions of the Order, for the leaving during the permitted hours of such vehicles as are passenger vehicles, goods carrying vehicles or invalid carriages displaying a valid parking ticket or permit. Motor cycles park free;

(ii) the maximum initial period for which a vehicle displaying a valid parking ticket may be left during the permitted hours in the parking places specified in Schedule 1 to this notice will be 2 hours;

(iii) the charge for short term parking in the parking places specified in Schedule 1 to this notice will be 20 pence for 20 minutes, 40 pence for 40 minutes, 80 pence for 1 hour and £1.60 for 2 hours, the tickets for which will be issued by pay and display meters;

(iv) the interval before a vehicle may again be left in a parking place after the expiration of the period for which the initial charge was incurred will be 2 hours;

(v) any resident whose usual place of abode is in any street specified in Schedule 4 to this notice may apply to the Council for the issue of a residents permit valid for use in the parking places specified in Schedules 2 and 3 to this notice;

(vi) a maximum of 3 permits per residential postal address will be issued by the Council or its agents, to persons whose usual place of abode is in any street specified in Schedule 4 to this notice. The charges will be £50 per annum (£25 if the vehicle engine size is less than 1100cc) or £31 for 6 months (£15.50 if the vehicle engine size is less than 1100cc) for the first permit, £75 per annum (£43.50 for 6 months) for the second permit and £100 per annum (£56 for 6 months) for the third permit. Unexpired permits that have been paid for and surrendered to the Council will be entitled to a refund of one twelfth of the charge paid (one sixth for 6 months permits) in respect of each unexpired month, subject to a maximum refund of 3 months;

(vii) any resident whose usual place of abode is in any street or part of street specified in Schedule 4 to this notice may apply to the Council for the issue of visitor's permits up to a maximum of 150 per annum per residential postal address at a cost of 50 pence per permit per day of use. Unlimited additional visitors permits issued to the same residential postal address cost £1 per permit per day of use;

(viii) any resident whose usual place of abode is in any street or part of street specified in Schedule 4 to this notice may apply to the Council for the issue of a household visitor permit valid for use in the street for which it is issued at a cost of £75 per annum;

(ix) any person who occupies premises in any street specified in Schedule 4 to this notice and who uses such premises for non-residential purposes may apply to the Council for the issue of a general business permit (maximum 3 permits per individual organisation) valid for use in the parking places specified in Schedules 2 and 3. The charge for each general business permit will be £300 per annum (£160 for 6 months, £90 for 3 months);

(x) any person who occupies premises in any street specified in Schedule 4 to this notice and who uses such premises for non-residential purposes may apply to the Council for the issue of a liveried vehicle business permit (maximum 3 permits per individual organisation) for any of its vehicles marked with the Company livery for use in the parking places specified in Schedules 2 and 3. The charge for each liveried vehicle business permit will be £180 per annum (£100 for 6 months, £60 for 3 months);
