PROPOSED BANNED U-TURN—MOOR LANE/GILDERS
ROAD, CHESSINGTON

1. Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Royal Borough of Kingston upon Thames propose to make the above-mentioned Order under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.

2. The general effect of the Order would be to prohibit vehicles proceeding in an easterly direction in Moor Lane from making a U-turn at the junction with Gilders Road.

3. The Order, and other documents giving more detailed particulars of the Order, including a plan showing the location and effect, are available for inspection until 6 weeks have elapsed from the date on which either the Order is made or the Council decides not to make the Order at:

the 2nd Floor Reception Area, Guildhall 2, Kingston upon Thames KT1 1EU, between 9.30 am and 4.30 pm on Mondays to Fridays inclusive; and

Hook and Chessington Library, Hook Road, Chessington KT9 1EJ, during normal opening hours.

GREEN BELT (LONDON AND HOME COUNTIES) ACT 1938

LAND AT WALL HALL COLLEGE, CHURCH LANE,
ALDENHAM, HERTFORDSHIRE

Part of the land known as Wall Hall College, at Church Lane, Aldenham, Hertfordshire ("Wall Hall College") is included in land designated under the Green Belt (London and Home Counties) Act 1938 ("the Act"), as part of the Green Belt round London ("the Green Belt Land") and is subject to covenants pursuant to the Act which restrict its use and to the provisions of section 10 of the Act which restrict the erection of buildings on the Green Belt Land.

The purpose of the Act is to make provision for the preservation from industrial or building development of areas of land in and around London.

The County Council has received an application for its consent under the provisions of the Act for the erection of new residential buildings on the Green Belt Land.

A drawing of the development proposed on the Green Belt Land and a plan showing its location can be inspected, free of charge, at the offices of the County Development Unit, at County Hall, Pegs Lane, Hertford, Hertfordshire, by prior appointment with the County Development Unit on telephone number 01992 556255, and between the hours of 9.00 am and 5.00 pm Monday to Friday.

Any representations in respect of the proposed development must be made in writing to the Director of Environment, Hertfordshire County Council, Hertford, Hertfordshire SG13 8DN, and be received by 27 February 2004.
