Waples, Feb. 3. N. S. The Imperialifts at Mehazzo being fufficiently provided with Stores and Neceffaries of all Sorts, for maintaining themfelves there fecurely; Sir George Byng failed Yefterday with feveral Men of War for Port Mahon, having left a Squadron on this Coaft to attend the Motions of the Spanish Men of War that are in Meffina, and ordered fome Cruizers to ply between Sicily and Sardinia. Af Port Mahon Sir George will give Directions for refitting the Men of War, and making the neceffary Preparations for affifting the Imperialifts early in the Spring to reduce all Sicily. In the mean time he will go to Gibraltar, to make Peace with the Moors, who appear very defirous of it.

Petersburg, Jan. 23. Yesterday in the Even-ing the Czar fet out from hence for Olonicz, being accompanied by Major General Jagoschinski, and fome other Favourites, but with very few Attendants; none of the Chancery nor any of the Foreign Ministers are gone with him; partly becaufe his Czarish Majesty will not concern himself with any Affairs while he uses the Waters, and partly because the Place is not capable of giving Reception and Entertainment to a numerous Company. There is Advice, that a Swedish Captain of the Guards having been fent to Aland to fieze M. Stambke, Secretary to Baron Goertz, Stambke put himfelf under the Protection of M.Ofterman, the second Muscovite Plenipotentiary, with whom he made his Escape to Finland; and 'tis faid they are both of them

fafely arrived at Abo. Caffel, Feb. 23. The Queen of Sweden has fent Captain Greifencraniz to the Landgrave, to notify her Acceffion to the Crown : Her Majefty's Letter was written with her own Hand, and contained only Compliments on that Occafion. This Express arrived here the 12th Inftant, and purfued his Journey next Day to Deuxponts, to take Poffersion of a Bailliage which belongs to the Queen.

Hague, Feb. 28. On the 21ft Inftant the States of the Province of Holland nominated M. Haflaer, one of the Magistrates of Amsterdam, for the Embaffy to Sweden: But this Nomination is not yet confirmed by the States General, the Deputies of the reft of the Provinces having written to their respective Principals for Inftru-Stions, before they would approve the Choice. On the 23d M. Whitworth flood Godfather, in the Name of his Britannick Majefty, at the Christening of a Daughter of M. Duyvenvoorde, lately Ambaffadour of this State in England. On the 25th the States of the Province of Holland separated, and are to meet here again on the 15th of next Month. A Dispute is risen between the Administrator of the Austrian Netherlands, and the States General, about the Processions of the Roman Catholick Clergy at Venlo.
