Venice, February 17.

Orders are given for disarming the Men of War which arrived lately from the Levant; and the Nobles who came in them from thence, as well as those who came from Dalmatia, are performing Quarantain. The Corpse of the late Captain-General Andrea Pisani is placed for a certain Number of Days in the Chappel of the new Lazaretto, with Tapers round the Coffin, and every Day eight Masses are said there for the Repose of his Soul. Letters from Dalmatia advise, that General Mocenigo was returned to Cattaro, and the Turkish Commissary had retired to one of the Frontier-Places of Albania, waiting till the melting of the Snows will give them an Opportunity to finish the settling of the Limits between the Dominions of the Port and those of this State; which they could not go on with, because in several Places the Roads were intirely unpassable. Sig. Priuli, who was lately chosen Ambassadour of this State to the Ottoman Port, has desired to be excused from accepting that Employment. A Merchant-Ship of this City, is arrived from Smyrna: The Master reports, that the Turkish Fleet being returned to Constantinople was disarmed. Sig. Diedo, Captain Extraordinary of the Men of War of this Republick, having finished his Quarantain in the old Lazaretto, came from thence on the 8th Instant, and on the 9th went to the Senate, accompanied by many of the Nobles, to give an Account of his Services against the Turks in the Levant, and of the Condition of the Fleet. The Diversions of the Carnival have drawn hither a great Number of Strangers.

Berne, Feb. 22. On the 18th Instant the Deputies of Neuchatel, who had been here six Weeks to sollicit the taking off the Prohibition of the Importation of their Wines into this Canton, set out from hence to return home. The Day before their Departure, they presented a Memorial to the Sovereign Council, wherein they refuse to accept of any Favour which this Canton may offer, in relation to the Sale of their Wines; but insisting on the Right they peremptorily pretend to, they refer the whole Matter to the Arbitration of a Third or Neutral Party; such Reference to Arbitration being expressly mentioned in their Treaty of Comburghership, in case of any Disputes which might happen between the Two States on account of the said Treaty. They were entertained, during their Stay here, at the Expence of this Canton. Two Days ago died M. Bucher, one of the Members of the Little Council here, in a very advanced Age: He had been formerly Banderet and Treasurer of this Canton. To Morrow he will be interred, and immediately after the Sovereign Council will proceed to the Election of a new Counsellour in his Room. According to Advices from Genoa of the 12th Instant, they had Letters there from Messina of the 2d, which related, that the Intendant Patihò had received Orders from the Spanish Court to repair forthwith to Madrid, to give an Account of the Situation of Affairs in Sicily.

Brussels, Feb. 23. On the 9th Instant at Night his Excellency the Marquess de Priè caused a Council of State to be extraordinarily assembled, to consult with them what Methods to use for preventing further Tumults and Disorders. On the

the 10th a Council of War was held privately at his Excellency's House, at which assisted Field-Marshal Vehlen, his Brother the Lieutenant-General; Count Wrangel Governour of this Place, and the Marquess de los Rios; by whom proper Measures were settled for suppressing any Riots that may happen, and Corps de Garde were ordered to be placed in several Parts of the Town. On the 11th in the Morning, a Placaert was published pursuant to the Resolutions taken in the Council of State, by which all Vagabonds, and Strangers who could not give a good Account of themselves, were ordered to depart the Town in 48 Hours, and all Persons were forbidden to appear in the Streets masked during the Carnival. The Wives of the Prisoners taken up for the late Tumult, presented a Petition to the Council of State, but they referred them to the Marquess de Prié, who answered them, that Justice should have its Course. On the 14th and 15th strict Search was made in all the Publick Houses throughout the Town for Strangers and suspected Persons of both Sexes, and a good Number were seized and imprisoned. These being examined, some of them were adjudged to be Vagabonds, who had disobeyed the forementioned Placaert; accordingly on the 21st five of them were publicly whipped by the common Hangman in the great Market-place, and a sixth was branded on the Shoulder; after which they were all led to one of the City Gates and turned out.

That on their Appearance and Return of such Affidavits, the Warrant for Payment of the said Out-Pensioners will be made out to December 24. 1728; but that none will be entered on the Pay-Books, or entitled to the said Pension, but such as make their Appearance or send Af-

firmants, as before directed. That the like Method will be observed within two Months after the 25th of June next, and so to continue after every half Year following.
