- (a) provide a parking place that will operate at any time in Romola Road, at the side of No 132 Norwood Road for the exclusive use of vehicles displaying a valid Car Club permit issued in respect of that vehicle place by Lambeth Borough Council; and
- (b) permit vehicles displaying a valid Car Club permit issued in respect of that vehicle to park within any designated parking place for use by residents within the Tulse Hill controlled parking zone during the hours of operation of that parking place.

INTRODUCTION OF 20 MPH SPEED LIMIT RESTRICTIONS IN MITRE ROAD, UFFORD STREET AND WEBBER STREET

- 1. Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Lambeth, on 10 March 2004, made the Lambeth (20 mph Speed Limit) (No 1) Traffic Order 2004, under section 84(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Order will come into force on 29 March 2004. 2. In brief, the general nature and effect of the Order will be to impose a maximum speed limit of 20 miles per hour for vehicles using that part of:
- (a) Mitre Road, which lies between Nos 1 and 2 Mitre Road and its junction with Webber Street;
- (b) Ufford Street which lies between No 3 Ufford Street and its junction with Webber Street; and
- (c) Webber Street which lies between The Cut and the boundary of the London Borough of Southwark.
- 3. This is necessary to reduce the speed of vehicles in certain areas so as to improve road safety (particularly for pedestrians and cyclists) and the amenity of those areas.

WAITING RESTRICTIONS IN CHRYSSELL ROAD, HOLLAND GROVE AND VASSALL ROAD

- 3. Any existing prohibitions on waiting by vehicles in the lengths of roads specified in paragraph 2 above would be suspended.
- 4. The Order is necessary to improve road safety.
