We had Advice by Letters from Florence of the 14th I stant, that the Pretender was arrived there, and was gone on in all Hafte towards the Bolognese, to meet the Princels Sobiesky: But Yesterday we were informed by a Physician of this City returned from Novi, that he was seized at Voghera the 19th Instant, with the very same Equipage he fet out from Rome, and conducted to the Castle of Milan. This is all the Knowledge we have hitherto of this Occurrence. We have Advice from Rome, that Sig. Patino, who had been expected for some Time, arrived at Civita Vecchia on the 12th Instant with two Spanish Gallies. By Letters from Naples of the 10th we have Advice from very good Hands, that the German and Spanish Generals have had fome Conferences relating to the Evacuation of Sicily by the Spaniards.

Paris, March 4. Yesterday we received, by the Post from Italy, Advice from Genoa, that the Presender was fiezed the 19th of last Month at Voghera; and carried to the Castle of Milan. The Letters from Turin by the same Post, say the same News had been current there several Hours; but afterwards it was reported that the Lords Mar and Perth with others of the Pre-

tender's Retinue only were sezed.
