## Venice, February 18.

🗂 Everal Tartans laden with Wax, Silk, and other Merchandize, are lately arrived here from Dulcigno. The Mafter of one of those Tartans, which performed Quarantain in Istria, reports, that he learned there by fome Veffels come in from the Levant, that fix Men of War at Corfu were taking on board the two German Battallions of Marshal Schuylemburg's Regiment, which have been disbanded and are returning home. Sig. Loredano who commanded there as General of the Islands, is to return hither on board one of the faid Men of War, with other Nobles and Officers who ferved the Republick in those Parts during the late War: After which the faid fix Men of War will be laid up in the Arfenal here. The Senate has conferred the Command of one of their chief Men of War upon Sig. Pefaro, who lately arrived from the Levant, and has finished his Quarantain in the new Lazaretto. They write from Mantua, that two Expreffes had paffed by that City having been fent by the Viceroy of Naples to the Imperial Court, with Difpatches relating to the Affairs of Sicily; and that another coming from Vienna with Letters for the faid Viceroy, had paffed there likewife, taking the Road of Tufcany. Several of the Imperial Troops quartered in the Cremonele and Parme-Ian, have been detached for the Kingdom of Naples. On the 16th the Carnival ended with the Diversions ulually given on that Day to the Populace in St. Mark's Square, as the cutting off the Head of a Bull, a Man's gliding down a Rope from the Top of St. Mark's Steeple, &c. There was a vaft Concourfe of People, the Vice-Doge, the Senate, and the Pope's Nuntio being prefent.

Berne, March 1. On the 23d paft M. Bucher, Member of the Little Council here, and ancient Banderet and Treafurer of this Canton, was interred with

the usual Solemnity; and foon after, the Soveraign Council of Two Hundred proceeded to the Choice of another Perfon in his Room. M. Morlot and M., Mutach, two ancient Bailiffs, were proposed, and the Voices of the Council being equal, the ruling Avoyer, who on the like Occasions has the casting Vote, gave his to the former, who immediately after took the Oaths in Qua-This Canton lity of secree Counfellor. has ordered the Committee appointed for examining the Differences between this State and that of Neufchatel, to draw up a Letter to the King of Pruffia, in order to reprefent to his Majefty the true State of the Matter in Dispute. They have likewife ordered their whole Proceedings to be printed and published. The whole Body of the Protestant Cantons has written a Letter to His Britannick Majefty, to implore his Affiftance and Interpolition at the Court of Vienna, in favour of the Protestant Churches in Hungary. It is advised from Coire, that the three Leagues are treating with Baron Grouth the Impetial Minister, about the Passage of the

Emperour's Troops thro' their Country. Hambourg, March 3. Yesterday we received Letters from Stockholm, dated the toth of February, which advise, that the States of that Kingdom having affembled, had paffed a Refolution that the Princefs Ulrica was become Queen by Right of Election, not of Succeffion; to which Refolution her Majefty gave her Affent. Some of these Letters fay it was expected the Stares would declare the Prince of Heffe King, and veft the Royal Authority jointly in him and the Queen his Confort. The Count de la Marck, Ambassadour of France, has written to M. Pouffin the French Refident here, that he intended to fet out from Stockholm on the 21ft of laft Month; but as Orders have been fent to him to remain in Sweden, which Orders were difpatched from Copenhagen on the 18th paft, they will meet him on the Road, and oblige him to return to Stockholm.

Hague, March 7. M. Colfter, who is appointed Ambaffadour to the Court of Spain, was married here on the th Inftant, and fet out the fame Evening for .Rotterdam, whence he is to continue his Journey to Day by the Way of Paris. The Province of Frifeland have very earneftly recommended M. Burmania to the States General, for Ambaffadour to Sweden; and as the States of Holland have on the Inflances of Amflerdam, propoled M. Haaller, an Efchevin of that Town, for that Embassy, this will create a Dispute in the Assembly of the States General. Letters from Drefden fay the King of Poland had declared the Marriage of the Prince his Son, with the eldeft Princess of Austria; tho' it was not yet owned at the Court of Vienna.
