ENFORCEMENT OF OBSTRUCTION TO DROPPED FOOTWAYS AND VEHICLES CROSSING OVER FOOTWAYS AND VERGES

1. Notice is hereby given, in accordance with section 3 of the London Local Authorities and Transport for London Act 2003, that the Council of the London Borough of Croydon has resolved to exercise the powers conferred by that Act:

(a) to issue penalty charge notices to vehicles obstructing dropped footways when requested to enforce the prohibition by the occupier of residential premises, which is not shared by other premises, to which the driveway is the vehicular entry or exit to the premises; and

(b) to serve a notice to occupiers of premises where vehicles habitually are being driven across a kerbed footway or a verge in the highway to or from those premises that they are in contravention of Article 16 of the above-mentioned Act.

2. The Council's powers will replace the powers of the Metropolitan Police to take action against drivers in relation to obstruction of the highway

3. The Council intends to commence the operation of these powers with effect from 2 August 2004.

LONDON LOCAL AUTHORITIES AND TRANSPORT FOR LONDON ACT 2003

ENFORCEMENT OF MOVING TRAFFIC CONTRAVENTIONS

1. Notice is hereby given, in accordance with section 3 of the London Local Authorities and Transport for London Act 2003, that the Council of the London Borough of Croydon has resolved to exercise the powers conferred by that Act to issue penalty charge notices for contraventions of traffic managaement Orders which impose restrictions or prohibitions on the movement of vehicles or certain classes of vehicle within the Borough.

2. The Council's powers will replace the powers of the Metropolitan Police to take action against drivers contravening those Orders.

3. In general, the traffic management Orders referred to above are those which require vehicles to proceed in particular directions at specified points, prohibit them from making certain movements or entering defined areas or restrict the movements of certain classes of vehicle. All such requirements, restrictions or prohibitions are indicated by the relevant traffic signs in accordance with The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.
