TE have Advice from Olonicz, that the Czar continued to take the Medicinal Waters of that Place with fo good Success, that he looked upon his Health to be perfectly reflored, and intended to leave off Drinking them at the End of this Week, and to return hither in a Fortnight after. The States of Courland now affembled at Mittau, have acquain.ed his Czarish Majesty by an Express, that they have agreed to all the Proposals made to them on his Part, and that they fubmit to the Directions he has given them not to appear at the General Dyet of Po-land, which is to be held at Warlaw in May next, and at which they are summoned to appear by their Deputies. The faid States have by the same Express defired the Dutchess Dowager of Courland, the Czar's Niece, to return to that Dutchy. By the Treaty of Marriage between that Princels and Frederick William the late Duke of Courland, 40000 Dollars per Annum were fettled on her for a Dowry, to be paid out of the Revenues of Courland ; and Frederick William Markgrave of Brandenburg-Swet, who is shortly to marry her, having a Right to the Allodial Part of the Succeffion of Courland, as being made over to him by way of Ceffion from feveral Female Heirs of the Ducal Family, will by this Matriage become possel of the most valuable Part of that Dutchy. General Pifani was interred in the Church belonging to the Carthulians, with all the Pomp and Solemnity proper for the Obsequies of a Man who had diftinguished himself in the Service of his Country, and who loft his Life by a fatal Accident whilft he was abroad difcharging his Duty to the Publick. An English Ship from Scanderoon, but last from Zant, which Port she left 12 Days ago, confirms, that the Grand Signior keeps up his Land Forces, and rather encreafes them, which gives a Jealou-fy to the Ruffians who keep a watchful Eye upon the Motions of the Turks on their Frontiers. Several fmall Veffels coming from Istria bring Advice, that one of our Men of War is arrived there from the Fleet, having on board Sig. Loredano who was General of the Islands du-ring the late War. That Ship is to be laid up in our Arfenal, where they work with all polfible Expedition in fitting out two others, on board which Sig. Ruzzini is to fail for Constanfantinople, in the Quality of Ambassadour to the Porte. Sig. Prioli being nominated Am-bassadour of the Republick to the Imperial Court, is preparing for his Journey to Vienna. Sig. Grimani, the prefent Ambaffadour from this Republick at Vienna, is to fucceed Sig. Duodo in the Embafy at the Court of Rome. Letters from Brescia say, that several Noblemen

of the Milanele are arrived in that City, in order to meet Count Colloredo, their new Gonour, who is hourly expected there. The fame Letters tell us, that two feveral Couriers have paffed through that Place to Vienna, being difparched one after another by the Regency of Milan.

The Elector of Bavaria having fome Time ago, by a Letter to the States, defired their Friendship and good Offices towards the the Election of his Son, Duke Philip Maurice, to the Bishoprick of Munster; their High Mightineffes have fent an Anfwer to his Electoral Highnels, affuring him of their Readinels to promote the Intereft of his Family on this Occasion. We have an Account from Paderborn, that the faid Duke was elected the 14th Inftant Bishop of that See, and in all Probability he will like-wife carry the Election for the Bishoprick of Munfter, which is to come on the 21ft Inftant. M. Pesters, Resident of the States General at Bruffels, has acquainted their High Migh-tineffes, that the Marquels de Prié has or-dered the first Quarter of the Subfidy of 500000 Crowns to be paid to the States General pursuant to the late Convention about the Barrier Treaty, though the Ratifications have not yet been exchanged, and the Council of Fi-nances has actually iffued Orders for this Purpole. The faid Marquel's has recommended the Prince de Ligne to the Emperour to be his Commissioner for taking Poffession of the Places which the States are to give up to his Imperial Majefty, pursuant to the said Convention, and expects that the States will name one on their Part, to whom fuch other Places as the Emperour is

to give in Exchange, are to be delivered up. Paris, March 22. Orders are given for 18 Batallions of Foot, 16 Squadrons of Horle, and two Regiments of Dragoons, to march to Normandy
