THE EALING (WAITING AND LOADING RESTRICTION) (SPECIAL PARKING AREA) (AMENDMENT NO 214) **ORDER 2004**

THE EALING (BUS PRIORITY) (AMENDMENT NO 11) **TRAFFIC ORDER 2004**

- 1. Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Ealing, hereinafter called the Council, on 3 June 2004, made the above mentioned Orders under sections 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended.
- 2. The general effects of the Waiting and Loading Restriction Order will be to further amend the Ealing (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Special Parking Area) (No 1) Order 1994 so as to impose waiting restrictions, operative at any time, on lengths of streets specified in Schedule 1 to this notice.

Details of exemptions to certain vehicles and persons are contained in the original Order of 1994.

- 3. The general effect of the Bus Lane Order will be to further amend the Ealing (Bus Priority) Traffic Order 2000 so as to designate bus lanes, operative between 7.00 am and 7.00 pm every day of the week, on the lengths of streets specified in Schedule 2 to this notice.
- 4. Copies of the Orders, which will come into operation on 7 June 2004, of the Council's statement of reasons for making the Orders, together with plans showing the locations and effects of the Orders can be inspected until 15 July 2004, during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, at Mouchel Parkman, 22-24 Uxbridge Road, Ealing, London W5 2BP.
- 5. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Orders may, within 6 weeks of the making of the Orders, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

Newmarket Avenue, Northolt, both sides, between the western kerbline of Pett's Hill and a point 15 metres west of that kerbline.

Pett's Hill. Northolt:

- (i) from a point 12 metres south of the southern kerbline of Newmarket Avenue and a point 10 metres north of the northern kerbline of Newmarket Avenue.
- (ii) between the common boundary of Nos 87 and 89 Danemead Grove and the common boundary of Nos 81 and 83 Danemead Grove;

Dorchester Road, both sides, between its junction with the carriageway surrounding Pett's Hill roundabout and a point 2 metres north of the common boundary of Nos 2 and 4 Dorchester Road.

Whitton Avenue West, Greenford:

- (a) the north side, between its junction with Pett's Hill roundabout and the western kerbline of the access road adjacent to Nos 736 Whitton
- (b) the south side, between its junction with Pett's Hill Roundabout and the western side of the access to the Fire Station.
