## A PROCLAMATION.

## GEORGE R.

Hereas we are informed, That divers Seamen and Seafaring Men are gotten into Inland Counties, with defign to shelter thems lives there from our Service, and by their so absconding, when there is a preffing Occasion for their Service, we have reason to apprehend, that our Ships, which are now fitting out, cannot be fo timely manned as the Service may require, notwichstanding all the Endeavours that have hitherto been used, both by preffing and entertaining Vuluntiers; we do therefore, by and with the Advice of oar Privy Council, firitiy charge and require all Justices of the Peace and other Magistrates of every Town and County within this Kirg-dom, but more especially of those Towns which lie on the Road from any Sea-Port Town to London, That they use their utmost Endeavours to apprehend and seize all Stragling Seamen, Watermen, Bargemen, Fishermen, and Lightermen, which are of able Bodies, and fit to firve on Board our thips, and which shall be met with by or before the Teuth Day of May next; and caule them to be fent to the nearest Sca-Ports, where any of our Ships of War, or Tenders belonging to the fame, thall be, namely, Deptford, Woolwich, Chatham, Sheernefs, Harwich, Portfmouth, and Plymouth; and we enjoin them to take Care, that fuch Straglers be delivered to the Officers and Commanders which shall be on Board fuch Ships of War or Tenders. And we do hereby further command and direct, That the Officers (who receive fuch Stragling Seamen or Seafaring Men) give Receipts for them; and that they insert in such Receipts, not only the Names of the Men, but the Names of the Ships or Veffels they shall be entertained for, together with the Time when, and the Place where, they are fo received. And we hereby further direct and require all our Captains, Lieutenants, and o-ther Officers of our thips of War, That they do not receive Any Old Men or Boys, or Infirm or Difeafed Perfons, unfit for our Service. And as an Encouragement to all Officers and others, who shall apprehend and send on Board any of our Ships of War or Tenders, any such Stragling Seaman or Seafaring Man, we do hereby order and direct our Principal Officers and Commiffioners of our Navy, to give Orfers to the Clerks of the Gheque at the faid feveral writes (upon producing to them fuch Receipts from the Officers of our Ships of War, who received fuch Men on Board our Ships of War or Tenders) to pay unto the Perfons fo bringing and delivering fuch Stragling Seamen or Safaring Man, Ten Shillings for every Man who shall be brought within Twenty Miles from that Place where he or they were first taken up, and Six Peuce per Mile for every Man who shall be brought above Twenty Miles, over and above the aforefaid Ten Shillings. And that our faid Principal Officers and Commiffioners of our Navy do direct the faid Clerks of the Gheque at the several Ports, not only to keep an exact Account of the Money by them expended in this Service, but that they take Care, that the faid Men, for whom Receipts shall be given, be put on Board fome of our Ships of War, or Tenders to them belonging; and that such Receipts as shall be so tendered them, be delivered up into the Hands of the faid Clerks of the Cheque, upon the Payment of the Allowances be-fore-mentioned; and that they caule to be transmitted to of the Cheque, upon the rayment of the Allowances be-fore-mentioned; and that they caufe to be transmitted to the Principal Officers and Commillioners of our Navy, a true and just Account of the Names of the Men they re-ceive, and the ships or Veffels on which they put them on Board, together with the aforefaid Receipts, that so they, the faid Commillioners of our Navy, may be the better mabled to inspect into the Validity of the faid Accounts.

GEORGE R. . I IS Majefty, for vindicating the Honour of his Treaties and Engagements, and for the Prefervation of the Rights and Advantages of his Subjects, find-ing himfelf obliged to declare War againft Spain, is refolved, in fo juft and neceffary an Undertaking is reloived, in to juit and necessary an Undertaking, in Conjunction with his Allies, vigoroully to profe-cute the fame. And being most gracioully inclined to give all due Encouragement to the Valour and Fidelity of his Subjects, ferving on board any of his Ships of War or Privateers, hath thought fit, by the Advice of his Privy Council, to publish and declare, that if any Ship, Veflel, or Goods, belonging to the Enemy, or otherwife liable to Confifcation, fhall be feized or taken at Sea, or in any of the Ene-my's Ports, Havens, or Rivers by any of his Majefly's Ships of War, or Merchant Ships employed in his Service, and fhall be condemned and adjudged as lawful Prize to his Majefly, the fame, as foon as conveniently may be, fhall be appraifed, and, after due and publick Notice, openly fold by Inch of Candle, to the beft Advantage; and after fattsfy-ing the Duties and Cultoms payable by Law, and the legal and neceflary Charges thereupon, the neat Proceed of all fuch Prizes fo taken, thall be divided into eight equal Parts; whereof the Captain or Captains of any of his Majefty's Ships of War, who fhall be actually on board at the taking of any Prize, fhall be allowed two eighth Parts: But in Cafe any Prize fhall be taken by any Ship or Ships of War, under the Command of a Flag or Flags, the Flag-Officer or Officers being actually on board, or directing and affifting in the Capture, to have one eighth Part of the faid Prize: But in Cafe there be no flag. Officer, the Captain to have that one eighth Part likewife in Addition to his two eights : To the marine Captains, or the Captain of a Company of Foot, who ferves on board as a max rine Captain, sea Lieutenants, and Master, shall be al-lowed one eighth Part, to be equally divided amongst them : The marine Lieurenants or Lieurenant of Foot Companies, ferving on board as Marines, Boat (wain, Gunner, Purser, Carpenter, Masters Mate, Chirurgeons and Chaplain, one eighth Part, to be equally divided amongst them : The Midshiphen, Carpenters Mates, Boatswains Mates, Gunners Mares, Corporals, Yeoman of the Sheets, Coxswain, Quarter-master, Quarter-orders Maras, Chicurteens, Martes Verman, Otartermafters Mates, Chirurgeons Mates, Yeoman of the Powder room, and Serjeants of Marines, or the Serjeants of Foot Companies ferving on board as Marines, one eighth Part, to be equally divided amongft them: The Trumpeters, Quarter-Gunners, Carpen-ters Crew, Steward, Cook, Armorer, Stewards Mate, Cooks Mate, Guhlmirh, Cooper, Swabber, ordinary Trumpeter, Barber, able Seamen, ordinary Seamen, Voluntiers by Letter, and marine Soldiers, or land Soldiers, ferving on board as fuch, two eighth Parts, to be equally divided amongst them. And in Cafe any fea Captain, inferior Commission or Warrant sea Otficers, belonging to any Ship of War, for whom any Shares of Prizes are hereby allowed, be ablent, and not on board at the time of the Cap-ture of any Prize, the Share of flich fea Captain, inferior Commission or Warrant lea Officer, fhall be east into the Shares hereby allowed to the Trumcaft into the Shares hereby allowed to the Trum-peter, Quarter-Gunners, Carpenters Crew, Steward, Cook, Armorer, Stewards Mate, Cooks Mate, Gun-fmith, Cooper, Swabber, ordinary Trumpeter, Bar-ber, able Seamen, ordinary Seamen, Voluntiers by Letter, and marine Soldiers and land Soldiers, fer-ving on board as fuch to be equally divided a-mongft them.
