Oporto, March 13. HE Maîter of a Portuguese Ship lying in the Port of Vigo, has written the following Letter to one of his Owners here.

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Vigo, March 10. I have used great Diligence to discover the true Rea-fon of imbargoing our Ship, which I find is this; there are two Men of War at Corunna lading warlike Stores, and two Persons of Distinction were come from Madrid, (one of them faid to be the late Duke of Ormond.) who lodge a League from the City to be the more private: They were expecting fome Men of War and above 50 Transports from Cadiz, with Soldiers and Stores, and at Corunna were a confiderable Number of English, Irish and Spanish Officers who are to imbark on the faid Ships : Their Defign is thought to be to make a Descent on fome Part of Great-Britain or Ireland, and what makes me judge this very probable is, that an Order is come for an Irish Pilot married in this Place, and for the Conful who is also an Irith Man, to repair immediately to Corunna and to imbark on the faid Ships; and because no Notice should be given to the English in Portugal, this Im-bargo is laid. This I thought proper to acquaint you with, that you might know the true Reason of our Detention.

Berne, March 29. Upon Complaints made lately to the two Cantons of Zurich and Berne by the Abbot of St. Gall on one. Side, and his Subjects of both Religions in the County of Tockenburg on the other, npon fome new Diffetences alifen between them, the faid two Cantons have written to both Parties to exhort them to a Pacification, by fending them the Explanations they defired upon certain Points in the laft

Treaty of Baden, which not being fo clear as was to be wifhed, have given Rife to this Difpute. The Sovereign Council here goes on with their Deliberations upon the Means for the further preventing the carrying the Mo-. ney out of the Country; for that End they have made feveral Projects for establishing divers Sorts of Manufactures in this Canton, and a Committee has been appointed to inquire whether it be poffible to plant in their Territories Tobacco, a Commodity very much coveted by the Peafants, and the faid Committee has already fent for People from foreign Parts to make Trial hereof fuch Plantations. Advices from Floz. rence of the 17th Inftant give an Account, that the Marquels Octaviano de Medicis, who hitherto had kept incognito in the Kingdom of Naples, pretended to get himfelf acknowledged lawfully a Descendant of the Family of the Grand Duke of Tufcany; and that he was to go to Rome, to follicit this Mat-ter, and to publish Memorials to that Purpofe.

Copenbagen, April 1. We have Advice from Flastrand, that Major-General Arnold was arrived there from Norway: We expect from him an Account of what has paffed in that Country within these eight Weeks, during which Time the Posts have been hindred from coming by the Ice. The Collonels Baffewitz and Lewenohm are gone over the Sound : The former has written a Letter from Helfingbourg, advising that he had found there two Majors, who were ordered one to accompany him and the other Collonel Lewenohm, till they arrive at Stockholm. Rear-Admiral Tordenschiold will fpeedily put to Sea with four Men of War, and three Frigates from 20 to 26 Guns: This Squadron is to cruize in the Baltick, and observe the Motions of the Swedes
