PROPOSED STOPPING-UP OF A LENGTH OF HIGHWAY (LAND) ADJACENT TO NEWFOUNDLAND DRIVE, PITWINES EAST, POOLE

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 247 of the above Act, which will authorise the stopping-up of a length of highway (land) adjacent to Newfoundland Drive, Pitwines East, Poole.
