N humble Address of the Justices of the Peace, High Sheriff, and Grand Jury for the County of Northumberland, at their General Quarter-Seffions of the Peace held for the faid County at Morpeth, the 8th of April, 1719, was this Day prefented to His Majefty by Francis Blake Delaval, Efq; Knight of the Shire for that County, introduced by the Right Honourable James Graggs, Elq; one of His Majefty's Principal Secretaries of State.

An humble Address of the High Sheriff, Justices of the Peace, and Grand Jury of the County Pala-tine of Durham, at their General Quarter-Seffions for the Peace the 8th of April, 1719. was this Day presented to His Majesty by John Hedworth, Esq; Knight of the Shire for the faid County, introduced by the Right Honourable James Craggs, Efq; one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State.

Which Addresses His Majesty was pleased to receive very gracioufly.

Westminster, April 18. His Majesty came this Day to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes feat-ed on the Throne; with the ufual Solemnity, Sir William Saunderfon, Gentleman-Ufher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Meffage from His Majefly to the House of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers. The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majefty was pleafed to give the Royal Affent to feveral publick and private Bills, and to make the following most Gracious Speech to both Houses.

My Lords and Gentlemen,

Am now come to put an End to this Seffiun, in which you have shown many great and feasonable Proofs of your Daty and Affestion to my Person and Government, and of your Care for the Suffety and Welfare of your Fellow-Subjects.

By the Bleffing of God on our Endeavours, We have Bitherto disappointed the ill Designs of our Enemies, who flattered themselves with Success from our unhappy Diwifions.

We perceive by the rash and wicked Counsels which have lately prevailed in the Court of Spain, that the defperate and extravagant Projects of one ambitious Man, though not capable of giving Fears to their Neigh-bours, may occafion to them fome Expence and Trouble. That Court being influenced by Gounfels odious and

destructive to the Spaniards, who find themselves neg-lected and oppressed, after having endeavoured to foment Conspiracies and Seditions both here and in France, and ftooped to Practices unufual, accompanied by Manifestoes of a Stile unbeard of among great Princes, has at last proceeded to acknowledge the Pretender.

As this News has given great Surprize to all Europe, I quefion not but it will be received by every good Briton with Indignation and Contempt.

It is our Happiness at this Juneture to find our Selves affified by the greatest Powers of Europe against an Ene-my that has no Allies, but those who would betray the Governments under which they live and are protected.

Gentlemen of the Houfe of Commons,

I thank you very heartily for the Supplies you have granted me this Year. The manner in which you have raifed them without any new Burthen to my Peoples the great Addition you have made to the Fund for finking the Debts of the Nation, the Discharge of the Exchequer Bills, and the Provision you have made to pay whatever

remains justly due to Foreign States and Princes, are the strong of Proofs of your Wildom, as well as of your Zeal for my Service, and the Good of your Country. You may olferue I have hitherto been very cautious of making use of the Power you have given me, to increase our Fores by Sea, and Land. If our Enemies should oblige me to a greater Expence; it shall be employed for your Service. This is what the Truft you repose in me requires at my Hands, and what I owe to so dusiful and affectionate a House of Commons.

My Lords and Gentlemen;

There being nothing more defireable at all Times than a firm Union between Protestants, I reflect with Satism faction upon the Law you have passed this Sellion, which will, I hope, prove effectual to that Purpose. As it is a faction upon the facture of the state of the sellion of the fignal Instance of Moderation and Indulgence in our establifted Church, fo I hope it will beget fuch a Return of Gratitude from all Diffenting Protestants, as will great ly tend to her Honour and Security; both which I shall ever have near at Heart,

I have always looked upon the Glory of a Sovereign, and the Liberty of the Subject, as inseparable ; and think it is the peculiar Happinels of a British King, to reign over a free People. As the Civil Rights therefore, and Privileges of all my Subjects, and especially of my two Houses of Parliament, do justly Claim my most render Concern; If any Provision designed to perpetuate these Bleffings to your Posterity remains imperfect, for want of Bieffings to your Polierity remain imperfect, for want of Time, during this Seffion, maturely to difcufs and fettle Matters of fo great Importance, I promife my felf you will take the first Opportunity to render my Wishes for your Happiness compleat and effectival, and to strengthen the Union, which is of fo much Confequence to the Wel-fame of this Wingdom fare of this Kingdom.

If the Gircumfiances of my Affairs shall allow of my going Abroad this Summer, I shall take the same Care going Abroad this Summer, I hall take the Jame Carg of your Interest as if I remained here. The many Negon tiations which will be on foot to restore the Peace of the North, in which the Trade and Tranquillity of this Kingdom may be very much concerned, will make my Presence there of great Use to these my Dominions : And as in that Case I design, by the Bissing of God, to meet you early next Winter, I will only recommend to you most compele that the lowing associated as the mended earneftly, that, laying afide all Animofities, you would, in your feveral Countries and Stations, use your utmost Endeavours to preferve the publick Peace, and fee a due Execution of the Laws.

The Post that arrived here Ye-Paris, April 24. storday, with the Lotters from Madrid of the 10th Inftant, brings us no manner of Account of the Spannh Fleet. The best Intelligences are politive, that they are not returned into Cadiz, nor into any Port of Bifcay or Galicia ; to that it is looked upon as very likely, that unlefs they have been able to fetch the Canaries, the greatest Part of them must have perished. A Captain of a French Ship that arrived the 14th Instant at St. Malo, and failed the 13th past from Cadiz, and who has written Saither that he overtook the faid Fleet in the Latisude of Cape St. Vincent, has paffed the fame Judgment of them ; giving for one Reason of his Opinion, that for these 20 Years past he had not been in fuch tempestuous Weather, as at the time he sparted from that Fleet, and that he narrowly escaped perishing often in this Voyage. M. de Silly was to have marched on the 15th Inftant, with 12 Batallions and 400 Horfe, towards St. Se-bestian; but the rainy Weather had obliged him to defer his March till the 17th.

* From on board the Dorfetshire off the Lizard, April 12. The Earl of Berkeley has detached Vice-Admiral Mighells to the Coaft of Galicia for Intelligence, with His Majefly's Ships the Windfor, Monmouth, and Antelope! The Gibraltar, which is expected to join us in a Day or Two, being a clean Ship, will be fent after him. The two Men of War formerly detached by his Lordship to get

Intelligence, are expected back daily. Rock-fler, April 13.
