Kensington, May 28.

THIS being His Majesty's Birthday, there was a very numerous and splendid Appearance at this Court, where the young Princesses reside at present, of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction; and at Night there were Illuminations, Bonfires, and other publick Demonstrations of Joy throughout London and Westminster.

Naples, May 23. To Day the Fleet of Transports with the Imperial Reinforcements, sailed from Baya, consisting of about 170 Vessels, among which are 36 Ships from 100 to 600 Tun, the rest are Barks, Pinks, and Tartans, the whole under the Convoy of seven British Men of War commanded by Admiral Byng: The Number of Foot embarked on these Transports is between 11 and 12000, and of Horse and Dragoons above 2000. They have with them Artillery and Stores of all Sorts. Deserters from the Spanish Camp before Melazzo, report that their Army consists of about 15000 Men; and that the Marquess de Lede promises himself the Assistance of a Number of the Peasants when he shall require it. 'Tis said the Imperialists design to land between Melazzo and the Faro; in order to attack the Spaniards on one Side, while those which are at Melazzo charge them on the other.

Berlin, May 27. The King of Prussia has been taken up all this Week in Mustering and Exercising the five Regiments of Foot which passed in the general Review on the 19th Instant, and is extremely satisfied with their Performances. To Day the *Gens d'Armes*, who make about 700 Men, have been likewise reviewed; and on the 30th Instant his Majesty sets out for Pomerania to see the Forces which are there in Quarters. The Markgrave Albert and Markgrave Christian are gone thither before, to receive him at the Head of their Regiments. His Majesty is expected back here on the 8th or 9th of next Month, and in a few Days after will go to

Cleves. Count Golofkin, the Russian Minister, has received Advice that the Czarowitz Peter Petrowits, the Czar's only Son by the present Czarine, is dead at Petersbourg, to the inexpressible Grief of their Majesties.

Paris, June 4. On the 1st Instant an Express arrived here from Marshal Berwick, with an Account that the Trenches were opened before Fontarabia in the Night between the 27th and 28th of last Month. We have Advice, that on the 25th past the King of Spain was within seven Leagues of Pampelona. The Regent has named M. de Vincelles a Brigadier, to go to Naples, there to reside during the War in Sicily; and he will set out from hence in two or three Days.

Plymouth, May 27. This Morning arrived Captain Charles Hardy, in His Majesty's Ship the *Defiance*, with the *Guernsey*, *St. Albans*, and *Lynn*, having on board Gen. Sankey's Regiment, and two Companies of the Royal Regiment of Fusileers. They left Port-Mahon the 18th of last Month.

The Commissioners for Examining and Determining the Debts due to the Army, give Notice to the Officers of the Regiments under-mentioned, which served abroad during the late War, that they have directed the Collonels, or the said Regiments, or their Agents, to state the particular Accounts of the said Officers, and also of the Troops and Companies of the said Regiments, agreeable to the Regimental State determined by the said Commissioners, and to lay them before the Commissioners with all convenient Speed: And the said Officers are hereby required, by themselves, or their lawful Attornies, to adjust and settle their particular Accounts with the said Collonels, or their Agents, on or before the 28th of July next; at which Time the Collonels, or Agents, are required to lay the Accounts so distributed before the Commissioners, in order to their Determining and Certifying the Debts due to the said Officers: Also all Persons that have any Assignments made by the Officers of the said Regiments upon their Arrears of Pay due in the said Regiments, are required forthwith to enter their Assignments with the Agent of the Regiment to which the Officer under whom they claim did belong; and the Agents are required, upon producing the said Assignments, to make true Entries thereof, expressing the Assignor's Name, Quality, and Troop or Company, in which he served, the Assignee's Name, the Sum assigned, and Date of Assignment, and to lay the same before the Commissioners, together with the Accounts of the said Regiments; and all Persons concerned in the said Assignments may have Access to the Agents to exam-

mine.
