Whitehall, June 5. N humble Addrefs to His Majefty from the High Sheriff, Governour, Deputy-Governours, Juftices of the Peace, the Proreflant Clergy, Gentlemen and Freeholders of the County of Cavan, and the Corporations of Cavan and Bellturbett, having been transmitted by his Grace the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland to the Right Honourable Mr. Secretary Craggs, has been laid before their Excellencies the Lords Juffices.

Berne, May 31. The Sovereign Council here continues its Déliberations upon encouraging all Sorts of Manufactures in this Country, and upon hindering the further Exportation of Money, which is very learce; for which End they came to a Relolution fome Days ago to oblige every Body that is any ways employed by this State, to weat no other Appatel but what Ihall be actually manufactured in this Canton. The Commissioners which went lately on the Patt of this State to Laufane to visit that Academy, are expected back here to Day: It is faid that things have pafied there, with great Quietnels and Moderation. The Republick of Geneva has written a Letter to this State, to acquaint them with the Step they had lately raken at the Requisition of His Britannick Majefty's Mihister there, in causing the late Lord Mar with his Papers to be fiezed. Letters from that Place advife, that an Apartment had been fitted up at the Town house for the faid Lord Mar, whither he had been removed from his Inn; to be more fecutely kept till his Majefty's Pleasure be known.

The Parliament of Bourdeaux have published an Ariêt, cenfuring the Declaration in the King of Spain's Name lately difperfed, and forbidding the vending or ottering the fame on the Penalty to all Offenders of being freated as guilty of High Treafon. On the 8th Inffant, the King of Great Britain's Birth day, the Earl of Stair his Ambaffadour at this Courf, gave a very magnificent Entertainment, to feveral Dakes, Marthals of France, foreign Minifters, and other Perfons of Quality and Diffinction. Letters from the Army commanded by the Marthal Berwick advife, that the Siege of Fontarabia is carried on fuccefsfully with all Diligence. Dublin, May 29. Yefferday being His Majeffy's Birth-day, the Nobility and Gentry attended his Grace the Lord Lieutenant in the Prefence-Chamber of the Cafile, where was alfo a great Appearance of Ladies; there was a Song in Honour of the Day, accompanied with a Confort of Mufick of the beft Performers in the Kingdom, which was ended by a Floatrish of the State Trumpers, and, on a Signal given, there was a triple Difcharge of the Ordnance ; after which his Grace, in his Stare-Coach, attended by a Body of Horfe, made a Tour on the Strand ; the Stewards for the Feaff, with the Nobility and Gentry, waited on him in their Coaches. From thence they repaired to the Tholfel to Dinner, where was a fplendid Entertainment provided by the Scewards : Dinner being endethis Grace went to the Play, where there was a very great Appearance ; the Play being over, his Grace with the Ladies and the reft of the Company went to the Fire-works, which with Bonfires, Illuminations, and Ringing of Bells, concluded the Day's Solemnity. His Grace defigned a Ball at the Caftle, but confidering it would be too great a Farigue to the Ladies after the Fire-works, it is appointed to be to Night. Edinburgh, May 30. Letters of the 25th In-ftant from Invernels, give us Reason to con-clude that Major General Wightman, who arrived at that Place the Day before, marched a gainst the Rebels on Tucsday or Wednesday laft. ' It is believed here the King's Forces will not find any Body of the Rebels together, except the Spaniards in order to furrender. It is adviled, that there are no Men of any Note with them, except fuch as are attainted. As there are divers Perfons in this Town, Ene-As mies to His Majefty's Government, who have endeavoured to perswade others, that there were no Prisoners taken in Donan-Caffle, it was thought proper that those brought by the Flamborough Frigate into Leith Road, should be landed, which was done on the 28th, and they marched through the Town into the Castle. By Letters of the 19th from Captain Holland Commander of His Majefty's Ship the Affiftance, we learn, that the Blow the Rebels received lately in Cafile Donan had obliged them to fhift their Quarters, and march to the Head of Lough Carran near Lough Kifferni where the Dartmouth and Affistance are at Anchor; and that there often happen small En-counters betwixt their Parties, and the Ships Boats, which are imployed to observe their Motions, and deftroy all Imbarkations of any kind whatever. These Letters add that there is a Difference between the late Marquels of Tullibardine, and Seaforth, and Marischal, upon the Point of Command, whereupon Tullibardine was removed with the Spaniards to a Place three Miles diffant from the others \$ a Deferter from the Spaniards had affured, that they would furrender upon the first Summons from a Body of regular Troops.
