Whitehall, June 20.

Yesterday his Grace the Duke of Roxburgh received the following Account from Major-General Wightman by Expres.

Glenfeshell, June 11, 8 a-Clock in the Morning. Yesterday I marched from Strachlony to the Head of Glenfeshell, a considerable Pass which I was told the Enemy had resolved to defend; but upon my Approach they deserted that Post, and retired to cover their Camp, which was at another very strong Pass called Strachell. I gave them no Time, but immediately viewed their Situation, and having made my Disposition began my Attack about Five in the Afternoon, and a warm Dispute was maintained till past Eight, when it pleased God to give us an entire Victory over them. Their Dispositions for Defence were extraordinary, with the Advantages of Rocks, Mountains, and Intrenchments; but the firm Resolution of the King's Troops overcame all Difficulties and we beat them through the Rocks and Passes in the Mountains, though we were not above half the Number I marched this Morning to Glenfeshell where I now am, and where a Spanish Officer is come to me with a Proposition from the Spaniards to surrender as Prisoners at Discretion, which I have granted them, and they are to come into our Camp at Two a-Clock this Afternoon. This Spanish Officer tells me, that the late Lords Seaforth and Marishal, with other attainted Persons embarked this Morning, and as I now hear great firing from our Men of War, I hope they have met with them. The Officer also tells me, that the late Lord Seaforth and Lord George Murray are wounded. I have not yet an exact Account of our killed and wounded, but judge them not to exceed 150, Officers included. By my next I shall send an exact List of our Loss. How much the Rebels have suffered is not yet perfectly known. Capt. Downes of Coll. Montague's Regiment was killed in the Attack.

Pyrmont; June 23, N.S. His Majesty continues drinking the Waters, which agree very well with him, and His Majesty designs to leave this Place this Day Sevenight.

Paris, June 24. Letters from the Army commanded by the Marshal Berwick relate, that on the 9th Instant the Prince of Conti found a Letter in his Tent, which it was believed came from Cardinal Alberoni, wherein the Kingdom of Sicily was offered to his Highness to tempt him to come over to the Side of Spain. Captain Johnson with three British Men of War came into Port Passage on the 10th: On the 11th he sent out some Men in Boats, who brought in three Spanish Shallops, in one of which were 14 wounded Soldiers that had been sent out of Fontarabia. He delivered the Prisoners to the Commanding Officer at Port Passage, and manned the said Shallops, with which and his own Boats he blocked up the Town by Sea, and prevented the conveying of any Supplies into it on that Side, till it surrendered.
