The faid Sovereign Council having been lately informed, that the Pealants and others who had Corn to sell, had fince the great Drought considerably raised the Price of it, have ordered their Magazines to be opened, and their Corn fold at a lower Price, in order to oblige private Men to do the same, which has produced a good Effect. They have likewise resolved to forbid their Subjects to sell any Corn to Foreigners, the Harvest not promifing great Plenty this Year. The Committee appointed by this State for Examining the Letter above mentioned from the City of Bienne to this Canton, concerning leveral Differenc's between them and their Prince the Bishop of Porentry, has made Report to the Council of Two Hundred which thereupon ordered an Answer to be returned to thesfaid City, advising it to affimble their Great Council, notwithstanding the Bishop's Orders to the contrary, and to chuse a Deputy to be fent to the General Dyet at Baden, where these Differences are to be treated of, in order to be brought to an Accommodation.
