

# The London Gazette.

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Falmouth, May 17.

**T**He 14th instant the *Virgin* and *Success* of this Port, put in here from *Cadiz* bound for *London*; they came from thence in Company of about 50 sayl of Merchant men, under the Convoy of His Majesties Frigats the *Guernsey* and *Fersey*; yesterday they sailed again from hence for the River of *Thames*.

*Cows*, May 20. This morning arrived here a Vessel in Six weeks from the *Barbados*, the Master confirms to us the good and healthy Condition of that Island, the Distemper which for some time with great violence continued amongst the Inhabitants there being now quite abated.

*Rome*, May 9. The Marquis de *Durazzo*, Resident here from the Republick of *Genoua*, hath lately given notice of his being recalled home, and is now upon his departure accordingly, upon the difference which some Months since happened, and still continues with great contest between that Republick and this See, concerning some matters relating to the Inquisition there; in which those of *Genoua* it seems, pretend to the same Priviledge and Power as the Republick of *Venice* hath for many years enjoyed; how this thing will be at length decided to satisfy both parties, we as yet see not.

The Princess *Rossano*, having at last given her consent to the Marriage concluding between her Son the Prince *Pamphilio*, and the Niece of the Cardinal *Facchinetti*, nothing seems at present wanting to compleat that match.

The Cardinal *Caraffa*, who of late hath been extreme ill, begins very much to mend, and to give dayly greater signs of his recovery. Signior *Pignatelli* late Nuncio at *Florence*, in *Poland*, and last of all at *Vienna*, is returned home some days since from those employments; yesterday he was to pay his duty to his Holiness, by whom he was very kindly received, and with great esteem, to the content of the whole Town and Court, as being a person of particular Worth and Merit.

We very suddenly expect the arrival of the Duke d' *Estrees* in quality of Ambassador from the Count of *Erantze*; together with his Brother the Bishop of *Luan*, for whom he comes, amongst other things, to sollicite the Cardinals Cap which is at present void. In the meantime we are here hastening his Equipage and other preparations for his Reception with all the diligence imaginable.

We are told that the Cardinal *Altieri* is upon the point of purchasing the Duchy of *Ariano*, a considerable Estate of the Duke of *Aquasparta*, which lies within few miles of this City.

Signior *Grimani*, who hath long resided in this Court, as Ambassador from the Republick of *Venice*, parted hence the 6th instant in order to his return home, being to be succeeded in his employment here by the Cavalier *Morosini*, whom we daily expect to arrive from thence.

From *Naples* they write, that they have lately re-

ceived orders from *Madrid*, for the raising of some Troops for the Service of that Kingdom; and that there is not the least discourte at present of Don *Pedro d' Aragon*'s leaving that Government and returning to *Madrid*, as was some time since generally reported.

*Cologne*, May 22. We have advice here, that the *Lorraine* Troops consisting of 4000 Foot and 1500 Horse, having passed the 20th instant the *Rhyne* at *Kayserswaert*, are at present quartered in *Urdingen*, *Lin*, and *Kemp*, three small places belonging to our Elector, within 8 Leagues of this Town.

In the mean time the Duke of *Lorraine* is still here; and goes not to reside at *Bonne* as was formerly said; we are told that his Highness hath acquainted our Magistrates, with his having given his Troops to the Elector, but that it was on condition, not to employ them against this place. The Heer *van Sypestein*, Envoy from the States General, having had several conferences with the Marquis de *Grana* and the Magistrates here, about the present state of affairs, is gone for *Bonne*, where our Elector at present is, to contribute all he may to an accommodation, of which there seems now of late some likelihood.

*Hamborough*, May 26. These parts are as present very still; from *Copenhagen* our Letters onely speak of the great preparations which are there making for the Kings Coronation, which is to be very suddenly. From *Warsaw* every Post brings us fresh fears of some Inroads this Summer upon those Countries, by the *Turks* and *Cossacks*, who they say, for certain are going to joyn in order to some considerable attempt; but that Kingdom being continually subject to such allarmes, and few Summers passing without the same reports, we hope all this noise may likewise at length come to nothing.

From *Bylevelt* we hear, that the several Deputies were arrived there, but had not yet had any solemn meeting in order to the commencing the Treaty; and that the Mediators seemed very much dissatisfied at the delays which are made in an affair of so great importance, and have accordingly sent directions to their Ministers at present there, to press those of *Lunenburgh* and *Munster*, to a speedy conclusion of this matter.

*Madrid*, May 8. The Third instant arrived here an Express from *Rome*, with advice of the Canonisation of the five new Saints, and amongst them, as what particularly relates to us, of Don *Francisco de Borgia* Duke of *Grandia*; which was received here with a general satisfaction, especially by the Fathers Jesuites, in whose Society it seems he had passed the later part of his life, with so great a reputation of Piety and Devotion, as to procure him at length this honor; the solemnity will be kept here with great Pomp and Magnificence, as is usually practiced in like cases.

The Queen hath lately made choice of Don *Fernando de Cordova*, some time since by her Majesty nominated to the Government of *Patama* in the *West Indies*, to be of the Council of War here. Monsignor de *Bonzi* Archbishop of *Ithoulouze*, and Am-
