

Secretary of State are required to pay special attention to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the area.

6. In considering proposals the Council will in particular take account of the document "Conservation Area Character Appraisal for Dudley Town Centre" that is published as Supplementary Planning Guidance.

The Public Inquiry into the objections to the North Wiltshire Local Plan 2011 will take place at Chippenham Town Hall, High Street, Chippenham. The inquiry will open on Tuesday 7 June 2005, at 10.00 am, and is estimated to continue thereafter until September 2005.

The Inspector appointed to preside over the Public Inquiry is Mr G Rowlands.

As the inquiry is held in public, any member of the public is entitled to attend the inquiry as an observer. However, only those who have submitted duly made objections to the local plan at either the first deposit stage in May 2003 or revised deposit stage in December 2004 are entitled to have their objections considered at the inquiry.
