ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE A43 TRUNK ROAD (NORTHAMPTONSHIRE- OXFORDSHIRE) (VARIABLE SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2005

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order, under section 84(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, on the A43 Trunk Road in the counties of Northamptonshire and Oxfordshire to provide a safe working environment for the workforce during routine maintenance works.

The effect of the Order will be to impose either a 40 miles per hour or 50 miles per hour speed limit on the

(a) A43 Trunk Road from the northbound entry and southbound exit slip roads at Junction 15A of the M1 Motorway at Rothersthorpe in Northamptonshire to Junction 10 of the M40 Motorway at Ardley Roundabout in Oxfordshire, including the circulatory carriageway of that roundabout; and

(b) all the slip roads connecting with the above length of road.

The speed limits, which will be in conjunction with lane closures, will only be enforceable when the appropriate traffic signs are displayed and will apply to a maximum length of 4 kilometres at any one time.

THE A46 TRUNK ROAD (ASHCHURCH, GLOUCESTERSHIRE) (RESTRICTION) ORDER 2005

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order, under sections 82(2), 83(1) and 84(1)(a) and (2) of, and paragraph 27(1) of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, on the A46 Trunk Road at Ashchurch in the county of Gloucestershire.

The effect of the Order, which comes into force on 20 June 2005, will be to impose a 30 miles per hour speed limit on the A46 from a point 75 metres west of its junction with Northway Lane to a point 106 metres east of its junction with Fitzhamon Park.

There is currently a temporary 30 miles per hour speed limit in force; this Order will make that permanent.

THE A4123 TRUNK ROAD (TIVIDALE, SANDWELL) (CLOSURE OF GAP IN THE CENTRAL RESERVATION) ORDER 2005

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under sections 1(1) and 2(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, on a length of the A4123 Trunk Road at Tividale in the Metropolitan Borough of Sandwell.

The effect of the Order, which comes into force on 20 June 2005, will be to close to vehicles the gap in the central reservation of the A4123 opposite its junction with Trafalgar Court, situated approximately 92 metres south-east of the A4123 pedestrian footbridge.

Any person wishing to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in, the Order, on the ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of, or of any Instrument made under, any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of 16 June 2005, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

London Borough of Barnet

THE BARNET (PROHIBITION OF STOPPING OUTSIDE SCHOOLS) (1996, NO 1) (AMENDMENT NO 8) TRAFFIC ORDER 2005

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Barnet have made on 16 June 2005, an Order under sections 6 and 124 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. This Order will introduce new no stopping school keep clear markings on Bigwood Road outside Henrietta Barnet School in order to prevent vehicles stopping on the extent of the markings, and reduce congestion at times where there is movement of pupils emerging from School entrances and to allow pupils to have a clear view of the road. The restricted periods are between 8.00 am and 4.15 pm.
