BY Letters from Hangut of the 29th past Advice is brought of the Czar's Arrival at that Place with his Fleet; the same Advices inform us that his Czarish Majesty designed to go from thence to Abo by Land, ordering the Ships and Gallies to make the best of their Way thither. Yesterday arrived at this Place M. Puskin, who has been employed at the Court of Denmark; he only waits here for an Opportunity to pass by Sea to his Czarish Majesty, in order to give an Account of his Negotiation.

Copenhagen, July 29. We have had no Letters from Norway since those of the 19th. The King of Denmark was then at Stromstadt, and the 16 Battallions which are to act against Mastrand were embarked. By the Master of a Ship taken and sent hither by Admiral Tordenschiold we learn, that the Danes began to bombard the Castle of Mastrand on Saturday the 22d at Two a-Clock in the Morning, and continued firing all that Day and the Day after, when the Master came away.

Berlin, July 29. M. Maash, who had been taken by the Muscovites in his Return from Stockholm and came hither some Days ago, has been with the King at Potsdam, to make his Report of the State of Sweden, and of his Usage at Petersbourg, where his Papers were seized and examined. M. Loos, Marechal of the Court of Saxony, has been here some Days. Mr. Whitworth, the King of Great Britain's Minister, is frequently with his Prussian Majesty.

From the Camp before St. Sebastian, July 30, N. S. The Siege of this Place is so far advanced, that we expect to be Masters of the Town To-Morrow or next

Day. Our Trenches are carried on to the Covered Way, and the Breach is in so good a Condition that Deserters come down it in the Day-Time to our Trenches. The Besieged have made a very mean Defence, having not attempted to make so much as one Sally; so that we have lost but very few Men. The King of Spain remains with his Army about Pampelona.

Paris, Aug. 6, N. S. This Morning Brigadier Buikley arrived here, being sent by the Marshal Berwick with an Account, that on the 1st Instant about Eight in the Morning the Governour of St. Sebastian beat a Parley: He demanded that Part of his Garrison should be allowed to march out of the Town thro' the Breach with all the Marks of Honour, and the rest to retire into the Castle; but was answered, that all must march into the Castle or none; whereupon he delivered up one of the Gates of the Town to the French, and retired with all his Troops into the Castle.
