PETROLEUM ACT 1998

NOTICE OF THE ISSUE OF A SUBMARINE PIPELINE WORKS AUTHORISATION

The Secretary of State for Trade and Industry hereby gives notice that
he has decided to issue, and in consequence has issued, a works
authorisation to be held by Shell U.K. Exploration and Production
whose address is Shell Centre, York Road, London SE1 7NA, for the
construction of a pipeline system between the Cutter QC Platform and
the Carrack QA Platform.

Except with the consent of the Secretary of State, the 406.4 mm Gas
Export Pipeline shall be used to convey wet gas and the 60.3 mm Import
Chemical Injection Pipeline shall only be used to convey (mono ethylene
glycol and corrosion inhibitor) chemicals.

The pipelines may be used by the holder and with the holder's
agreement, and with the consent of the Secretary of State, by other
persons.

Shell U.K. Exploration and Production have been appointed operators
of the pipelines.
