N Sunday the 20th Inftant were celebrated at the Imperial Palace of the Favorita, the Nuptials between the most Serene Archdutchess Mary Josepha of Auftria, and the most Serene Fre-dérick Augustus Electoral Prince of Saxony. The Empreis Amalia repaired thither about Three in the Afternoon from the Emperour's Palace in this City, with the Bride and the Archdutchess Mary Ama-lia her other Daughter. The Electoral Prince came about Six from Bitamberg, two Leagues from hence, and went directly to the Apartment of the Emperour's Great Chamberlain to repole himfelf till the Hour appointed for this Ceremony In the mean time the Empress Mother and the Arthdutchef-

les her Daughers came allo to the Favorita. ""About Eight in the Evening the Electoral Prince, preceeded by the Noblemen in his Retinue, went to the Emperour's Apartment, and from thence the Im-perial Family proceeded to the Emperour's Chapel. A great Number of the Nobility and the Imperial and Saxon Minifters marched before, being ranked according to their Quality and their feveral Degrees; then came the Electoral Prince richly dreffed in a Silver Stuff with Diamond Buttons followed by fome Silver Stuff with Diamond Buttons followed by iome Imperial Minifters; the Emperour came next, then the reigning Empress, the two Empresses Dowa-gets, leading the Bride, dreffed in a Silver Stuff, with jewelt of a very great Value, the Empress Mother Eleonon walking on her Right Hand, and the Em-press Amaila, the Bride's Mother, on her Left; then followed the Archdutchess Mary Amalia, the Bride's Sister, the Archdutchess Daughters to the late Em-perour Leopold, and then the Ladies of the Court and City in great Numbers.

The Company being entred into the Chapel, the Imperial Family placed themfelves under a rich Ca-nopy on the Right Hand of the Altar, which was fet out with Relicks and other Ornaments, and the Bride and Bridgeroom knowled at a Duck which had Bride and Bridegroom kneeled at a Desk which had heen laid for them before the Altar, and was hung with very rich Tapiftry. Round the Altar ftood, the Prince Bifhop of this City Count Sigifmund de Collorince Binop of this City Count Signadua de Cono-niez, affifted by four Prelates, viz. the Abbot of Melck, the Provoft of Clofterneuburg, the Abbot of the Scotch Convent in this City, and the Provoft of St. Dorothy, all in their pontifical Habits, befides the Curate of the Parifh in his Stole, the Emperour's Mafter of the Ceremonics, and all the Emperour's Chanling, each placed according to his Bank. His Chaplains, each placed according to his Rank; His Imperial Majefty having given a Signal, the faid Curate with an audible Voice read the Pope's Dif-penfation, the Bride and Bridegroom being related Curate with an audible Voice read the Pope's Dil-penfation, the Bride and Bridegroom being related to each other in the third and fourth Degree of Con-fanguinity and Affinity: This done, the Prince Bifhop 'folemnized the Matriage according to the Rites of 'the Church,' asking firft the Bridegroom, whether he accepted for his lawful Wife the moft Serene Mary Jo-feph'a Archdutche's of Auftria there prefent, and then Hkewife the Bride, whether fhe accepted for her lawful Husband the moft ferene Electoral Prince of Saxony Frederick Augufus, there prefent; to which each of them having anfwered in the Affirma-tive, the Curate delivered two Rings of great Va-lue lying in a Golden Difh, to the faid Prince Bifhop, who prefented them to the new marryed Couple, ac-cording to the Ceremony of the Church obferved in the. Like Cafe, after which he fprinkled them with Holy Water's then Te Deum was fung under the Difcharge of '30 Cannon, from the Baitions of the Chry, and a Volley of the Favorita, and the whole was concluded with the Bifhop's giving the Ponsifical Benediction.

At Nine a Clock their Imperial Majesties, the new At Nine a Glock their Imperial Majetties, the new Married Couple, and the Archdutcheffes went to the Great Hall, where a fplendid and fumptuous Enter-taining was prepared. The Tiable was of an ob-long Square, at the upper End fate the Emperour un-der a Canopy, with the Emprefs Mother on his Right, and the reigning Emprefs on his Left; on the Right Side of the Table, on the Right Hand of the Empress Mother, fate the Bride and Bridegroom; on the Left Side of the Table, on the Left Hand of the reigning Empress fate the Empress Amalia, and next to her the Archdutchess Mary Amalia, and then the Arch-dutcheffes Daughters of the late Emperour Leopold-The Table was covered with Variety of Sweet-meats, and other Dithes, which were carried in by the Emand other Difhes, which were' carried in by the Em-perour's Pages, and ferved up by the Noblemen of the Emperour's Court, the Mufick playing all Supper-Time.

The Turkish Ambassadour, though he has not yet had Audience of the Emperour, had the Honour to be prefent as a Spectator with some of the Principal Persons of his Retinue, in a separate Gallery built Perfons of his Retinue, in a feparate Gallery built on Purpole for him, who highly admired the Solem-nity, as well on account of its Pomp, as of the rich Dreffes and great Quantity of Jewels worn by those who were prefent at it; he was conducted thither, and reconducted to his House in one of Prince Eu-gene's Coaches, followed by three other Coaches, and accompanied by Lieutenant General Count Daun, Imperial Coundellour of War, who is the Emperour's Committer appointed to entertain the faid Ambaffa-Commiffary appointed to entertain the faid Ambaffa-dour, and M. Oettel, Imperial Councellour of War and Referendary.

In other Apartments the Ladies of the Imperial Court and of this City were entertained at two Ta-bles, as were at another Table the Princes, Ministers, and Noblemen of this Court ; the Diffes at those Tables being ferved up by the Members of the Courcil of this City, cloathed in black Velvet. The Entertainment being over, which lasted till after Eleven at Night, every one retired to their own Apartments, and the Empress Mother with the Arch-durcheffes her Daughters came back to this City

On the sift the Imperial Family and the Bride and On the slit the imperial Family and the Bride and Bridegroom, accompanied as the Day before, repaired again to the Chapel, where was fung the Maß pro Sponfis, according to Cuflom, and the Benediction was given to the new-married Perfons by the Bifhop of this City, affifted as before, the Curate of the Pa-rifh wearing a Rochet over his Stole. About Noon, the Archdutchefs gave Audience to the Reprefenta-tives of the States of Lower Auftria, who were Count tives of the States of Lower Austria, who were Count Harrach, Provincial Marshal of Lower Austria, and the feveral other Deputies of the four Orders, viz. the Prelates, the Lords, the Nobility, and the City of Vienna. The faid Count made a Speech congratulating the Archdutchess on her Marriage, and wishing her an auspicious Journey to Saxony, delivering to her at the same time a Piesent on the part of the States of the faid Province, to which the Archdutchefs made a gracious Answer, and admitted the Deputies to kiss her Hand. Soon after Count Weissenwolf, Prefident of the Deputies of the States of Upper Aufiria, was admitted to the Archdutchefs's Audience, who likewife made a Speech, congratulating her on Account of her Marriage, and prefenting her on the part of the States of Upper Auftria with a Donative, to which the Archdutcheis having made a gratious Answer, he was also admitted to kiss her Hand.

The Imperial Family having again dined together, they went to fee an Opera intuled Sirita, which was reprefented at the Theatre in the Favorita, the Turkifh Ambafiladour again being prefent, with his former Retinue; which being ended, the Imperial Family fupped together.

Yesterday the new married Couple after having dined again with the Imperial Family, took their Leave of their Imperial Majefties and the Arch-dutcheffes, and fet out for Saxony at Four in the Afternoon, pailing over the Bridge to the other Side of the Danube, being faluted with the Difcharge of the Cannon from the Baltions of the Town, on the Side where they paffed, and attended all the Way with the Acclamations of the People.
