THE A43 TRUNK ROAD (BRACKLEY HATCH, NORTHAMPTONSHIRE) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 2000

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under sections 1(1), 2(1) and (2) and 4(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 on the A43 Trunk Road at Brackley Hatch in Northamptonshire.

The effect of the Order would be to prohibit any vehicle from waiting at any time on the length of A43 Trunk Road which runs adjacent to the southbound carriageway of the A43 at Brackley Hatch, known as Brackley Hatch Service Road, between its junctions with the southbound carriageway of the A43.

(b) being used:

for police, fire brigade, or ambulance purposes, by a Highways Agency Traffic Officer or contractor, for providing a local authority service, for postal services, or for wedding or funeral purposes, or

- (c) being loaded or unloaded, would be exempt from the prohibition.

THE PROPOSED LICHFIELD DISTRICT COUNCIL (OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2005

The Lichfield Council (hereinafter called "the Council") in exercise of their powers under section 35 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (hereinafter referred to as "The Act") and all other enabling powers with the consent of the Staffordshire County Council in accordance with section 39(3) of the Act and after consulting the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with section 124 (1)(c) and Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act propose to make an Order the effect of which will be to consolidate the provisions of the Lichfield District Council (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 2002, and subsequent Variation Notices into one Order, and to:

- Inclusion of additional car parking facilities at Cross Keys car park.

All other car parking charges remain the same.
