Efferday went hence the Biffiop d' Aichfadt, Commiffioner for the Emperor at this Dyet, to his own house fome miles from hence, leaving in the mean three the management of those Affairs in the hands of a perfon of Quality, appointed by the Emperor to that purpole; the Plenipotentiaries affemble dayly, in order to the perfecting of those matters that lye before them, with so much earnestmels, that at present there seems to be a fair likelihood of fimally concluding dism, it is faid that the Emperor hath by his Letters, presed them to a speedy resolution in the matter of the Publick fecurity and the perpetual Capitulation, the perfecting of which, would be set a set and advantage to the whole Empire.

Vienna, May 20. His Imperial Majefty having been pleased, in confideration of the many and good fervices done him by the Count de Schafgotz, to receive him into the Council of State; yesterday the faid Count arrived here from Silesia, where his ordinary Residence is, on his way to Laermburgh, to attend his Imperial Majesty, who still continues with the Court there. The Count de Rothal, Principal Commiffioner for the Emperor at Presburgh, arrived here on Sunday faft, together with the Archbishop of Gran, to give his Imperial Majefly an account of the funcess of that Commission, intending to be hack at Presburgh again the 28th instant, in order to the finishing the Process of feveral perfons who are there upon their Tryals, about matters relating to the late Rebellion.

From Upper Hungary they write, that the General Spankaw, hath been to visit the several places and Fortifications of those parts, giving directions for the reinfurcing of some, and the demolishing others of less importance, as might best advance his Imperial Majesties service there.

We are told that the, Prirce of Transituania, in pursuance of the general Orders sent by the Grand Signior to all his Bassa and other Officers, not to give the least protection to any of the Rebels, but that they should rather put them into the hands of Justice, hath delivered up to such as are by the Emperor to that purpose appointed, several of those who had retired upon that account into those Countries.

Dantzick, May 23. From Warfam they write, that the Marriage of Prince Demerrius Wisnomitski, Unkle to the prefent King, and under General of the Army, with the Princess d'Offrog, had been there celebrated in a most magnificent and extraordinary manner for three days together; their Majesties hawing been pleased to grace the Solemnity with their Presence, and most of the Nobility of the Kingdom of both Sexes, appearing at it very rich and fplendid in their Apparel and Equipage.

That the Council of war had been held there for feveral days, and was then parted, having first refolved, that the King should immediately for the fecurity of the peace of the Kingdom, islue his

third and laft general Letters to the refpective Palatinates, fummoning the Nobility to appear well armed on horfeback, againft the middle of the next Month, according to the rules and orders, already preferibed in that particular, and fuch farther directions as they fhould receive from the Council of War, appointed to be held there again about ten days after; his Majefty withal declaring; that he would march with them in perfon into the *Ukrain*, to fecure in time the peace of thole parts : That the Princels *Wifnowitski* the Kings Mother, had been received there with very extraordinary refpect, and an univerfal welcom from the people.

Palermo, May 2. Our Vice-Roy the Prince de Ligny, being perfectly recovered of his late indilpolition, hath been advised by his Phylitians to change the Air, and to go and pais fome time in the Country, which in a day or two he accordingly intends, together with his Lady.

The 27th paft arrived here the Marquis de Bayonno, General of the Galleys of Sicily, together with his Lady, from the Court at Madrid; they were received here, by our Vice-Roy and the reft of the Nobility, who went out to meet them, in a very obliging manner.

a very obliging manner. His Excellency hath given orders for the fitting out a fquadron of Galleys, immediately to joyn as is thought, with those of *Maltha* and *Napless* in order to the keeping these Seas free from Pyrates this Summer.

Rome, May 9. The Marquis de Durazzo, Refident here on the part of the Republick of Genoua, may in few days depart on his way home, a Galley of that City being arrived at *Civita Vecchia* for his transportation; in the interim the difference concerning the Fathers of the Inquisition there continues still, though fome, who seem to be more active for the composing it, have offered, that there be added to the Inquisitor at Genoua two Notaries, the one to be an Ecclessifical Person, and the other a Secular; which Proposition, though it is thought most equal between the pretensions of both parties, will it is feared, not prove effectual for the accommodating this matter.

Here is a discourse of a Marriage to be treating between the Prince Giustiniani, and the second Sister of the Duke Gasparo Altieri, but through the many difficulties that seem to rise in several particulars, we shill doubt the success of it. On Thursday last was celebrated the Marriage of the Son of the Marquis Nari, with a Niece of the Cardinal Carpegna, in the presence of several Cardinals and other persons of quality.

A famous Aftrologer here about Town, having it feems foretold, as he pretended, that some person of the higheft quality here should die this Month, he was thereupon some days fince committed to prison for his prefumption, where it is thought, he may remain, without he give good security to employ his Talent, with more caution for the future. The Prince Pamphilio hath fince his Marriage with the Niece of the Cardinal Facchinetti, received the Complyments and visits of most of the persons of Quality about Town, to whom he has returned the like Civilities,
