Copenhagen, September 12.

THE Danes have unrigged and brought into Port most of their Fleet; and the Troops that were employed in Norway are gone into Quarters. The King of Denmark and the Prince Royal came hither on the 8th Instant, and this Morning returned again to Fredericksbourg. We have not had any Advices here from Sir John Norris since he sailed from Hanoë.

Hanover, Sept. 5, O. S. On the 3d Instant the Earl of Sunderland arrived here; and had the Honour to dine with His Majesty the next Day at Herrenhausen.

Hambourg, Sept. 15, N. S. We have an Account, that Sir John Norris with the Squadron of British Men of War under his Command, having been joyned by Rear-Admiral Hofier with seven Men of War, sailed from Hanoë the 3d Instant; that he passed by Carlshaven at Nine the next Morning; and it was not doubted he would that Day be joyned by the Swedish Fleet commanded by Admiral Sparre, which was cruising off Carlscroon in Expectation of his coming. The Wind was very fair and a fresh Gale, so that he could not fail of arriving in the Heighth of Stockholm by the 6th at farthest. The Czar of Muscovy with his Fleet of Men of War was on the 31st past in the Haff of Ahland; and his Gallies with the Land Forces were then in the Neighbourhood of Stockholm.

Hague, Sept. 19. All the Towns of the Province of Holland, Amsterdam only excepted, have newly given their Consent to M. Burmania's going Ambafadour Extraordinary from this State

to the Queen of Sweden. The other six Provinces had chosen him for this Embassy some time ago: So that he is now preparing, to set out for Sweden in a few Days.

From on board His Majesty's Ship the Ipswich in St. Helen's Road, Sept. 10. The Wind coming up Yesterday at South East by South, we sailed from Spithead, and came to an Anchor here, where we were joined this Morning by all the Transports. Since which, the Wind is come about to the Westward.
