ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

THE A19 TRUNK ROAD (CRATHORNE INTERCHANGE TO TONTINE INTERCHANGE) (PROHIBITION OF USE OF GAP IN CENTRAL RESERVATION AND U-TURNS) ORDER

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Transport has made an Order under sections 1(1), and 2(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 on the A19 Trunk Road in the District of Hambleton, which comes into force on Monday 16 January 2006. The effect of the Order is as described in issue number 57356 of the London Gazette dated 16 July 2004 (Ref: 151).

Anyone wishing to question the validity of the Order or any of its provisions on the grounds that it is not within the powers contained in the above Act, or any requirement of the above Act or any instrument made under it has not been complied with, may apply to the High Court before Monday 27 February 2006 to suspend or quash the Order or any part of it.

THE A3 TRUNK ROAD (THURSLEY JUNCTION) (ONE WAY TRAFFIC) ORDER 2005

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he made the above-named Order under sections 1(1) and 2(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 on 15 December 2005, coming into force on 16 January 2006, on the A3 Trunk Road at Thursley in the Borough of Waverley in the County of Surrey.

The effect of the Order is to impose a north-easterly direction One Way restriction on the slip road connecting the Thursley junction to the northbound carriageway of the A3 at the Thursley junction.

THE TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (CONTROL OF ADVERTISEMENTS) REGULATIONS 1992

Direction Granted under Regulation 7 prohibiting advertisements under Class 3A of Schedule 3, (Estate Agent Boards), in the areas specified below.

On 9 November 2005 the Secretary of State informed the London Borough of Camden that its application for a direction prohibiting the display of advertisements specified in Class 3A of Schedule 3, Part 1 of the Regulations in the following areas was successful:

1. Belsize Park Conservation Area.
2. Fitzjohn/Netherhall Conservation Area.
3. Redington/Froggnal Conservation Area.

The effect of the Direction is that the display of advertisements relating to the sale or letting of premises or land in these areas cannot be undertaken unless express consent has first been obtained from the Council. This Direction takes effect 14 days from the date of the publication of this notice.

THE CAMDEN (20 MPH SPEED LIMIT) (ROYAL COLLEGE STREET AREA) TRAFFIC ORDER 2005

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Camden on 5 January 2006 made the above-mentioned Order under section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985, the details as previously published on 7 July 2005.
