Vehicles being used in connection with the works will be exempt from the closures and width restriction. Vehicles being used by Highways Agency traffic officers will be exempt from the closures.

1. Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Hammersmith and Fulham, on 17 February 2006, made the abovementioned Orders under sections 9 and 10 of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to, the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985, and the Road Traffic Act 1991.

2. The general effect of the Orders will be to, as an experiment:

(a) further amend the Hammersmith and Fulham (Bus Lane) Order 1999, so as to introduce a new northbound bus lane at Wood Lane, the west side, from a point 9.5 metres north of the northern kerbline of the access road to Nos 54 and 56 Wood Lane to the common boundary of Nos 149 and 151 Wood Lane operating from 7.00 am to 10.00 am and from 4.00 pm to 7.00 pm, Monday to Saturday inclusive; (b) further amend The Hammersmith and Fulham (Waiting and

Loading Restriction) Order 1993, so that on Wood Lane, the west side, between a point opposite the southern kerbline of Ariel Way and the northern boundary of No 117 Wood Lane, and Wood Lane, the east side, between a point 10 metres north of the northern kerbline of Ariel Way and the northern boundary of No 117 Wood Lane, the hours during which the prohibition on waiting by vehicles operates is from 7.00 am to 7.00 pm, Monday to Saturday inclusive and the hours during which the prohibition on loading by vehicles operates is between 7.00 am and 10.00 am and between 4.00 pm and 7.00 pm Monday to Saturday inclusive.

3. Copies of the Orders, which will come into operation on 27 February 2006, and of documents giving more detailed particulars of the Orders, can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the end of a period of 6 months from the date on which the Orders were made at: Network Management Group, Highways and Engineering Division, Environment Department, Town Hall Extension, King Street, Hammersmith, London W6 9JU.

4. While the Orders remain in force the Assistant Director-Highways and Engineering, or some person authorised by him, may, if it appears to him or that other person essential:

(a) in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic;

(b) in the interests of providing suitable and adequate parking facilities on the highway;

(c) for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by the Orders runs; modify or suspend the Orders or any provision contained in them.

5. The Council will consider, in due course, whether the provisions of the Orders should be reproduced and continued in force indefinitely by

means of an Order under section 6 of the Road Traffic Act 1984 Any person wishing to object to the making of an Order for the purpose of such reproduction and continuation may, within the above-mentioned period of 6 months, or if any of the Orders are varied by another Order or modified pursuant to section 10(2) of the 1984 Act, beginning with the day on which the variation or modification or the latest variation or modification came into force, send a statement in writing of their objection and the grounds on which it is made to the Assistant Director-Highways and Engineering at the address above.

6. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any of the relevant requirements of that Act or of any relevant regulations made under that Act have not been complied with in relation to the Orders may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Orders were made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
