Copenhagen, November 7.

Orders are given for proclaiming a Cessation of Arms, and Freedom of Commerce, between this Kingdom and Sweden, for six Months. We have Letters from Stockholm of the 10th of October, O. S. which advise, that Sir John Norris with the Squadron of British Men of War under his Command, sailed from the Dahlers the 9th. The Lord Polwarth has received a Letter from Sir John Norris dated the 13th of October, O. S. at which time he was detained by contrary Winds at Elfenap.

Hambourg, Nov. 10. Captain Smith, who commands one of the British Frigates in the Baltick, arrived at Travemunde on the 7th of this Month: He brought over from Sweden Field Marshal Count Spar, who has sent his Retinue directly to France, but is gone himself to Hanover, designing to proceed from thence to Vienna, where he is to negotiate as Ambassadour of the Queen of Sweden, and is to go from thence to the Court of France with the same Character. On the 7th Instant the Duke of Holstein set out from hence for Hanover: It is said his Highness will go from thence to Berlin, and to Vienna, and that he proposes to return hither in six Weeks.

Brussels, Nov. 12. The Acts for putting the Emperour in Possession of the Civil Government of the Country given up to him by the Barrier Treaty, and those for putting the Dutch in Possession of the Extension of Limits in Flanders are exchanged, and the Prince Claude de Ligne is to go to Ypres and Tournay, with two Counsellors of the Finances in a little Time, to receive the Oath of Fidelity of those Towns and Chatellenies. The Pensionary of Flanders and the Count de la Ligne, are to go To-Morrow from hence to Ghent about the ordinary Subsidy demanded.

Hanover, Oct. 30, O. S. The King of Prussia has been hindered by Indisposition from coming hither so soon as he intended: But being now on the Road and expected here To-Morrow, his Majesty has put off his Departure till Tuesday the 3d of November next.

Hague, Nov. 14. It was advised from Rotterdam, that the Yachts with the Men of War commanded by Sir John Jennings, were come into the Maese the 6th Instant; but it proved a Mistake. They arrived on the 12th Instant at Helvoetsluys, where His Britannick Majesty designs to embark. The Marquis Berruti Landi presented Yesterday a Memorial to the States General to perswade them from entering into the Quadruple Alliance; but this Memorial containing nothing more than a Repetition of his former Reasonings on that Subject, no Answer will be returned to it; and it is expected their High Mightinesses will this Week declare absolutely their Accession to that Treaty, conformably to the late Resolution of the City of Amsterdam. The Province of Gelderland has taken a Resolution to banish all Roman Catholick Priests, and to have all Popish Churches in that Province shut up within three Months, in case the Elector Palatine does not redress the Grievances of the Protestants in his Country.
