Lisbon, October 28. N.S. HE Lord Hinchinbroke arrived here the 19th Instant, from the Lord Viscount Cobham. His Lordship has had Audience of the King and Queen of Portugal; who received him with great Marks of Favour. We have Advice that the late Duke of Ormond left Valladolid about the 20th paft, upon the Arrival of two Couriers that had been dispatched to him from the Court of Madrid; and that he was to imbark at St. Ander with about 1800 Men and Arms for a confiderable Number, on five Men of War, viz. the Admiral of 56 Guns, the Touloufe of 56, the Hermione of 40, the Fidela of 30, and the Galera of 14. Genoa, Nov. 7. The Montague, com-manded by Captain Beverley, and the

The Montague, commanded by Captain Beverley, and the Transports, continue at Vado: But as all the French Vessels that were expected with Artillery and Ammunition for Sicily are arrived, and those Stores are reladen on the Transports, we are hourly in Expectation to hear of their Departure, the Wind being come fair.

From the Camp before Roses, Nov. 7. The French Men of War which were defigned to block up Rofes by Sea are arrived, and lie at Anchor in the Road. For these three Days past we have had very ftormy Weather, with fuch violent Rains, that the Rivers having overflowed have laid the flat Country under Water, fo that there is hardly any Communication between the feveral Quarters of our Army; and during this Time the Men appointed to anlade the Tartans which brought the Artillery and other Stores necessary for making the Siege, could not work. This Day feveral of the faid Tartans being driven by the Storm upon the Beach, were bulged. It is not, yet known what can be recovered out of them: When that is known, the Marshal Berwick will determine, whether to undertake the Siege, or to end the Campaign.

Heidelberg, Nov. 11. Mr. Haldane, his Gentlemen, who are Britannick Majefty's Minister, has had his Majefty for Engl fome Conferences with the Ministers of of the Province of I the Elector Palatine, and continues his affemble Tor Morrow.

Inflances to his Electoral Highnefs, for redreffing the Grievances of his Proteftant Subjects, and ro-inflating them in the Posseffion of the Rights granted them by folemn Treaties. M. Hechr and M. Spina, Ministers of the King of Pruffia, and of the States General, are employed in the like Offices; and Yefterday M. d'Ofemberg Gentleman of the Bedchamber to the Landgrave of Heffe Caffel arrived here, with Inftructions to act in Concert with his Britannick Majefty's Minister on this Occasion. The Pope has written a Letter to the Elector Palatine, applauding his Proceedings against the Protestants, and exhorting him to perfift in his Zeal for the Roman Catholick Church.

Hanover, Nov. 3, O. S. The King of Pruffia arrived here the 31ft paft at Night, and was received with all due Honours. Their Majefties have fince had frequent Conferences; and having every Day dined in Publick, have fhewn on both Sides all the Marks of mutual Satisfaction. His Pruffian Majefty defigns to fet out on the 5th Inftant, to return to Berlin. The King intends to leave this Place on Saturday the 7th Inftant. The Duke of Holftein came hither fome Days ago, and went away on the 1ft Inftant.

Hague, Tuifday Nov. 10, O. S. His Britannick Majefly being to fet out from Hanover on Saturday laft, is expected on Thurfday next in the Evening at Helvoetfluys, where the Yachts with the Men of War commanded by Sir John Jennings are attending. This Morning the Earl of Cadogan fet out from hence to meet his Majefly at Schonhoven. The Earl of Sunderland arrived here laft Saturday Night, as did the Duke of Montrofs the next Day, and the Marquefs of Winchefter this Morning. The Earl Stanhope takes his Way by Schonhoven directly to Helvoetfluys; whither the Earl of Sunderland goes from hence on Thurfday, as do also the other Noblemen and Gentlemen, who are to embark with his Majefly for England. The States of the Province of Holland are to reaffemble To-Morrow.
