HIS Day the Marquifs de Cortanfe, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Sardinia, had his first private Audience of His Majesty; to which he was introduced by the Right Honourable James Craggs, Elq; one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by Sir Clement Cottrell, Master of the Ceremonies.

From on Board the Barfleur in the Mole of Messina, Nov. 3, N. S. The Imperialists have made an End of Levelling the Lines of their Camp, the Trenches, and the Batteries that were before the Citadel, and have fettled the Garrison for the Place. The laft Accounts we had of the Spanish Army commanded by the Marquess de Lede, were, that he had quartered his Troops in the middle and most plentiful Part of Sicily, from Paterno to Calascibetta and Castro-Giovanni; the latter is a very ftrong Post, where he is forming Magazines. General Mercy defigns to leave good Garrifons, not only in the Town and Citadel of Meffina, but in Melazzo and other neighbouring Posts, and to pass by Sea with the main Body of his Army to Syracufa. Yesterday the Generals Mercy and Zumjungen came on Board, and had a Conference with Sir George Byng, for Settling the transporting of the Imperialis to the faid Place.

Hambourg, Dec. 5. Brigadier Rantzau, who was sent by the Duke of Holftein to Stockholm as his Minister, but could not get Admittance to the Queen of Sweden, and was ordered by her Majefly to depart her Dominions, is arrived here. The Duke of Holftein left Berlin on the 26th past, in order to proceed by the Way of Drefden to the Court of Vienna. We have Advice from Petersburg, that the Czar having ordered his Ships of War to winter at Cronflot, two Frigates of between 30 and 40 Guns each, in their Voyage from Revel to that Place,

ran upon the Sands and were loft. Hambourg, Dec. 12. 'Tis advifed from Dresden, that the Duke of Holstein set out from thence on the 8th Inftant for Vienna, where it is faid he defigns to refide till the Congress at Brunswick be opened. Count Reventlau, who was formerly the Administrator of Holstein's Minister at Vienna, has been appointed by the Duke to refume that Character again at that Court in his Name, and he is gone thither before him. Berlin, Dec. 9. The Emperour has difpatched circular Letters to all the Princes concerned in the Northern War, inviting them in form to fend their Minifters to the Congress at Brunswick : They are dated the 17th paft. That for his Pruffian Majefty was brought hither on the 6th Inftant.

Hague, Dec. 15. M. Neny, the Marquels de Prié's Ágent, is returned hither from Brussels upon some Difficulties which yet obstruct the intire Execution of the last Convention relating to the Barrier-Treaty: He declares that the Proceeding of the Marquels de Prié with regard to the Dutch Ship taken by the Oftenders by way of Reprifal, has been approved by the Court of Vienna. The Refolution of the Province of Holland, for acceding effectually to the Treaty of Quadruple Alliance, and to all its fecret and feparate Articles, being now finally concluded and fettled in Form, will be prefented To-Morrow to the Affembly of the States General.
