

Paris, Dec. 27. By Letters of the 11th instant from Madrid it is advised, that Cardinal Alberoni was to depart that City the next Day the 12th. The King's Pleasure had been signified to the foreign Ministers, to address themselves to the Marquess Grimaldo. The other Secretaries of State were continued. His Catholic Majesty seemed not inclined to employ a first Minister any more in the Administration, and had appeared in Publick accompanied by the Grandees, and the Queen attended with a Circle of Ladies of the first Rank; both which had been a long time discontinued, almost from Cardinal Alberoni's entering upon the Administration. There are Letters from Italy which advise, that the Imperial Convoy was sailed from Messina for Trapani; and from Leghorn it is advised, that the Pope continued so very ill that his Life was despaired of.
