A PROCLAMATION.

Whereas his most Excellent Majesty hath thought fit to signify his Royal Pleasure, That the Parliament of this Kingdom, which stands now prorogued to the 14th Day of this Instant Decémbér, be further prorogued to the 23d Day of June next, we do therefore publish and declare, That the said Parliament be, and the same is hereby further prorogued to the 23d Day of June next; whereof the Lords Spiritual and Temporal in Parliament are to take Notice, and to give their Attendance accordingly. Given at his Majesty's Castle of Dublin, the 8th of Day Decémbér, 1719.

Brussels, Dec. 21. On the 17th Instant the Deputies of the States of Flanders were introduced by the Master of the Ceremonies to an Audience of the Marquis de Prié, who received them with particular Marks of Esteem, and returned them Thanks for their having so readily granted for his Imperial Majesty's Service, a Supply amounting to about two Millions of Florins; after which he gave them a magnificent Entertainment. Proper Letters have been sent to the Presidents of the Courts of Judicature in Luxembourg and Hainault, and it is hoped those Provinces will shew the like Zeal in consenting to a Supply answerable to the Emperour's present Occasions. On the 19th the Marquis de Prié, accompanied by the Governour of this Place, went to Mechlin to compliment the Archbishop there on his being promoted to the Dignity of Cardinal.

Paris, Dec. 30. This Day a Courier arrived from Rome with the Pope's Bull of Dispensation for the Marriage of Mademoiselle de Valois, Daughter to the Duke of Orleans, with the Hereditary Prince of Modena. This Courier has brought the News, that the Town of Palermo in Sicily submitted to the Emperour's Obedience, on General Zungun's Appearance off that Place with the Convoy having on board a Body of Imperialists which had been designed for Trapani. It is advised from Madrid, that on the 12th Instant Cardinal Alberoni left that Court to return to Italy. On the 27th Instant the Chevalier de Marsieux, Colonel of the Royal Regiment des Vaiffeaux, with a Swiss Officer, went Post from hence for Perpignan, in order to accompany Cardinal Alberoni from thence to Antibes, where he is to embark for Genoa.

Whitehall, Dec. 26. On the 23d Instant in the Morning the Right Honourable Earl Stanhope set out for the Court of France.
