Paris, Dec. 20. This Day a Courier arrived from Rome with the Pope's Bull of Dilpensation for the Marriage of Mademoiselle de Valois, Daughter to the Duke of Orleans, with the Hereditary Prince of Modena. 'This Courier has brought the News, that the Town of Palermo in Sicily submitted to the Emperour's Obedience, on General Zumjungen's Appearance off that Place with she Convoy having on board a Body of Imperialiss which had been defigned for Trapani. It is advited from Madrid, that on the 12th Instant Gardinal Alberoni left that Court to return to Italy.
