THE CITY OF SHEFFIELD (GRANVILLE GYRATORY PHASE 3) (A61 CLASSIFIED ROAD) SIDE ROADS ORDER 2006

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has confirmed, with modifications, the above Order which was made by Sheffield City Council under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980, and which, as confirmed, authorises the Council to: (a) carry out the improvement of highways,

- (b) stop up highways, (c) stop up private means of access to premises, and
- (d) provide new means of access to premises

all on or in the vicinity of the route of the classified road which the Council propose to improve comprising (i) St Mary's Road, Granville Square and Queens Road from its junction with the A61 Shoreham Street north-eastwards then south-westwards to a point 110 metres south-west of its junction with Farm Road; (ii) Matilda Street from its junction with the A61 St Mary's Road for 55 metres north-westwards;

and (iii) Leadmill Road from its junction with the A61 St Mary's Road for 40 metres north-eastwards.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980 or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or of any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of 26 September 2006, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
