Y E have an Account by Letters from Messina of the 30th of the last Month, that General Zumjungen ha ving embarked in that Port with 7000 Foot and about 500 Horfe on board divers Tranfport Ships, under Convoy of a small Squa-dron of British Men of War with several Bomb Veffels, failed towards Trapani, where he intended to creft a Magazine and to march from thence to Palermo. This Motion gave fuch an Alarm to the Marquis de Lede, that on the 26th he decamped and marched towards Leonforte, where he ordered all his Forces to rendezvous, abandoning his ftrong Holds particularly Taormina, La Mola and Francavilla, Catanea and Cattalibraro, which Places he had taken great Pains to put into the best Condition of Defence that the time he had to do it in would allow. It was faid he intended to march up to General Zumjungen and to attack him; but as this had been foreseen, and the proper Measures taken to disappoint him, it was not doubted but the General would be able to fland his Ground till he should receive a Reinforcement that was ready to embark upon the Return of the Transport Ships to Messian. He was allo to be joined by the Regiment. of Horfe of Lobkowitz, and fome other Troops that were to, be transported from Naples directly to Trapani, together with a confiderable Convoy of Provisions and Ammunition. Our Advices from Naples fay, they had received the News of General Zumjungen's be-ing fafe landed at Trapani with the Forces first above-mentioned.

Copenhagen, Dec. 23. A Review has lately been taken of the Seamen in the King of Denmark's Service and many have been difcharged; the reft are kept in pay to man the Ships of War defigned for next Year's Service, which are repairing in order, to be ready to put to Sea early in the Spring. His Majefty being informed that fome Perfons were fitting out Privateers to cruize under Mufcovite Colours against the Swedes and other Nations trading with them, has iffued an Order forbidding fuch Practifes under very fevere Penalties; and upon Sufpicion that a Ship which lately went out into our Road was defigned to be thus employed, fhe has been feized, and the Commander and his Crew have been imprifoned. Major General Leuenohra being appointed to go to the

Court of Sweden, with his Danish Majesty's Full Powers to treat of a Peace between the Two Crowns, is preparing for his Departure thither.

Hamburgh, Dec. 29. Letters from Sweden, give an Account, that the necessary Preparat tions- were made upon the Frontiers of that Kingdom for opposing any Irruptions which, the Mulcovites, taking Advantage of the Frofi might attempt to make into the Swedifh Ters ritories, a good Number of Troops being pla-ced in proper Stations for that Purpole, and Beacons crected in divers Places to give the Alarm upon any Motion of the Enemy. M. Burmaniag Ambaffadour Extraordinary from the States General, artisten at Stockholm the 26th of laft Month; the 28th he had a pri-vate Audience of the Prince of Heffe Caffel. and the 2d Inftant he had Audience of the Queen of Sweden, to whom he delivered his-Credentials, and made Compliments, in the Name of the States General, of Condoleance upon the late King of Sweden's Death, and of Congratulation upon her Accession to the Crown. Count Bielke was appointed her Swe-dish Majesty's Minister to the Most Christian King, and intended to fet out the 12th pa his Journey to the FrenchCourt. They write from Petersbourg, that the Czar had ordered new Levies to be made, intending to rein-force his Army with 20000 Men. Some Ad-

vices from thole Parts lay he was indisposed. Be lin, Dec. 30, N. S. The King of Pruffia returned hither the 23d Inftant from Wufterhausen; his Majesty has had * flight Indispo-firion, but is now in a fair way of Recovery. Our Letters from Stockholm bring an Ac-count that the Treaty for Settling the Pre-tentions on both Sides between this Crown and that of Sweden, is, by the good Offices of the Lord Carteret, Ambaffadour Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of His Majefty of Great Britain, and M. Campredon, the most Chriftian King's Minister, as Mediators, fo far advanced, there remaining but a few Points of little Importance to be adjusted, that we expect very loon to hear of its being finally concluded to the mutual Satisfaction of both Parties. The Emperour's Letter to the Czar, inviting him to fend Plenipotentiaries to the Congress intended to be held at Brunswick, in, order to conclude fuch Treaties as may be requilite to compleat the reftoring of Peace in the North, and to fecure the Tranquility of shole Parts, by lettling the Pretensions of the leveral Powers concerned, has been delivered.

The Placaert lately published forbidding the Exportation of Contra-band Goods to Spain, has had a very good Effect, in flopping some Ships that were fit-ting out for that Trade, and disappointing feveral Bargains that had been made for fending thither more Goods of that Nature. M. Ivoi, Quarter-Master General of Foot and Commandant of the Town of Boilledus; died there the 29th of the last Month, and is suc-ceeded as Quarter Maker General by M. Soravenniore, and as Commandant by Collonel Charles de Waffender. The States of the Pro-vince of Zeland have given Orders for the fhuiting up of three Popula Churches with in their Territòries, by way of Repri-zal for the Hardships impoled upon the Protestants in the Palatinate : We hear the Landgrave of Hesse Cassel has on the same Account ordered three Popilh Churches to be thut up in the Country of Rhinfeld. Our fast Letters from Madrid fay, that fince the Departure of Cardinal Alberoni from thence, the Dukes de Veraguas and Popoli, the Marquis d'Aguilar, and feveral other Persons of Note who had fuffered great Hardships during his Ministry, had appeared at Court, and were very graciously received by the King of Spain, who, it was believed, would employ fome of them, particularly those before named, in the Administration of publick Affairs.
