Stockholm, January 28.

Great many Members of the States of this Kingdom, who were fummon'd to meet here on the 14th of this Month, having been hindered by the ill Weather and bad Roads, from arriving against the prefix'd Day, the Opening of the Seflion was there-fore adjourned to the 22d. However the Nobility met as cultomarily, at their Houfe on the 16th to elect a Land Marshal or Speaker ; and Count Horn, formerly a Senator and Prefident of the Chancery, was cholen by a very great Majority: On the 18th a Deputation was appointed to acquaint the Queen therewith, though according to the prefent Constitution the Royal Approbation is not necessary to enable a Land Marshal to act as fuch. On the a2d the four Orders of the States went in the usual manner to attend the Queen at the Palace Royal; to which Solemnity all the foreign Miniffers where invited, when her Majefty being seated on the Throne, Count Meyer-feldt, as first Commissioner of the Chancery, fince Count Cronhielm was suspended, made a fhort Speech to the Affembly, acquainting them, that the Reason why the Queen found her felf oblig'd now to convene them, was, that they might be inform'd of the present Pofture of Affairs, to which End her Majesty had order'd an ample Account of all Transactions fince the last Session to be communicated to them, which was accordingly then read to the Af-fembly by M. Bark, one of the Secretaries of State; and afterwards the Speaker of each Order of the States made a fhort Speech to the Queen, and kiffed her Majesty's Hand, with On the 23d, the which the Solemnity ended. Nobility met at their House, when several Members made a Proposal, or Motion, as a flanding Rule to be observed during the present Section, that neither the Marshal, nor any private Member, should presume to offer any thing to the Deliberation of the States, which was contrary to the Form of Government established last Year ; but the faid Motion was rejected by a great Majority : Then they began to make feveral Orders to be observed in their future Proceedinge, which Affair they are still upon, and it will probably take up feveral Days more to fettle, and till that be done all other Businels is suspended. when the entered into her 33d Year, her Majefty was complimented by all the Sena-nators, foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, and that Night there was a Ball at Court. The Imperial Letters of Invitation to the Congress at Brunswick being fome time ago come to this Court, her Majesty lately named Count Taube, Governout of this City, M. van Stahden, at prefent Refi-dent at Regensburg, and Count Gyllenburg, late Resident in England, to be her Plenipo-tentiaries at the said Congress. The Commission appointed to examine into the Conduct of the Commandant and other Officers who fur-rendered the Caftle of Malftrand to the Dance, having some time ago condemned the Commandant to be beheaded, he was accordingly forthwith executed; they have now quite finished their Inquisition, and passed Sentence of Death on every Officer that was in the Place; but it is believed the Queen will pardon feveral of the least criminal. Admiral Wachtmeister is to Command the Bwedish Fleet next Summer.

Berlin, Feb. 19. N. S. One of his Britannick Majefty's Meffengers is arrived here from Stockholm, with the Treaty of Peace concluded, by the Mediation of the King of Great Britain and the most Christian King, between the Crowns of Sweden and Prussia. Which Treaty has received the Approbation of his Pruffian Majefty, who has given Orders for its being forthwith ratified.

Hague, Feb. 27. On the 23d Inftant the Marquels Beretti Landi, Ambaffadour of Spain, had a Conference with the Deputies of the States for foreign Affairs, and in the King his Mafter's Name defired their High Mightineffes to fign forthwith the Treaty of Quadruple Al-liance. This Morning the Earl of Cadogan and Count Morville the French Ambassadour, fettled with the Marquess Beretti Landi, the Form of a Convention for a Ceffation of Arms by Sea ; and they have agreed to fign it To-Morrow.
