### A PROCLAMATION,

Declaring the Sufpenfion of Arms by Sea, agreed upon between His Majefty and the Catholick King, and enjoining the Obfervance thereof. GEORGE R.

Hereas his Gatholick Majefty hath lately accepted and agreed to the Treaty made at London the 22d Day of July, 1718 : And whereas thereupon, for preventing the Effusion of Christian Blood, and for the better fecuring the Trade of our Kingdoms, and the Dominions there unto belonging, it bath been agreed between Us and his most Christian Majesty on the one part, and his Catholick Majesty on the other, by a Convention made at the Hague the 18th Day of February, 1719, as follows, that is to fay, That immediately from and after the faid 18th of February, 1719, there fould be a general Suf-penfion of all warlike Enterprizes, and of all Atts of Hoftility by Sca between the Fleets, Squadrons, and Ships of Us, and of his Catholick Majelty, and to be proclaimed in all Places requifite, with all convenient Speed; and that a full and free Use and Exercise of Navigation and Commerce should be established between our Subjects and those of his Gathelick Majesty, in like manner as the same was established immediately before the War was proclaimed : And to prevent all occasion of Complaints and Difputes, which may srife upon Account of the Refituti-on of Ships, Merchandizes, or other Effects, which may be taken at Sea, it hath been also mutually agreed, that such Ships, Merchandizes, and Effects which shall happen to be taken in the British and Northand Effects Seas, after the space of twelve Days, to be computed from the 18th Day of February, 1719, on which Day the Treaty of Suspension was figned; and that all Ships, Merchandizes and Effects, which shall happen to be taken after fix Weeks, from the faid 18th Day of February, beyond the faid British and the North Seas, as far as Cape St. Vincent; and that all Ships, Merchandizes and Effects, which shall happen to be taken after Ten Weeks, from the faid 18th Day of February, beyond the faid Cape St. Vincent, as far as the Equinectial Line, whother in the Ocean, or in the Mediterranean, and elfe-where: And lastly, that all Ships, Merchandizes, and Effects, which shall happen to be taken, after six Months, from the faid 18th Day of February, beyond the Equinotial Line, in any Seas what forver throughout the Globe, without any Exception, or further Diffinction of Time or Places, shall be restored on each Side: We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of our Privy-Council, to notifie the fame to all our lowing Subjects; and we do Declare, That our Royal Will and Pleasure is, and we do hereby frittly charge and command all our Officers at Sea, and all other our Subjetts what foever, to forbear all Acts of Hostility by Sea against his faid Ca-tholick Majesty, his Vassals, or Subjects, from hence forth, under the Penalty of incurring our highest Difpleasure.

Given at our Court at St. James's the Twenty eighth Day of Februrary 1719, the in Sixth Year of our Reign. God fave the KING.

Beine, Feb. 21. M. de Villars, a Subject of this Canton, and Marefchal de Camp and Collonel of a Swifs Regiment in the French Service, having asked Leave fome Days ago of the Sovereign Council here to raife Recruits for his Regiment, the fame was granted to him ac-cordingly, though this Regiment is not publickly avowed by this State. An Answer was dif-patched on the 17th Instant to the King of Prussia, to the Letter his Majesty wrote some time ago to this Canton, concerning the Differences between this State and that of Neufchatel, with Relation to the Wines of the latter. This Answer tends to justify the Pro-ceedings of this Republick on that Account, and to inform his Majefty more fully of the whole Matter. It feems the Conference which was propoled fome time ago on the Part of Zurich, to be held at Rapperswiel for accommodating the Differences between the Canton of Glaris and its Subjects of the County of Werdenberg, will not take Place by Reason of the Difficulties the Catholick Cantons make to fend their Deputies to the faid Conference, and to meddle in this Matter, which therefore will probably be referred to the General Diet at Baden in Midfummer next.
