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Lynn, June 12.

**Y**esterday arrived here the *Providence* of this place, in Five weeks from *James's River* in *Virginia*, from whence she came in Company of an other Vessel of *Hull*; the Master tells us, that he laded there at *Wotten Creek* in the County of *Baltimore*, 12 Leagues higher in the Bay, then ever any did before.

*Milan, May 17.* The Resident from the Duke of *Savoie*, is lately gone hence on his return home, upon order received from thence to that purpose; which as is said, by some who have more particularly been acquainted with affairs, is occasioned by a misunderstanding happened between our Governor and that Resident, upon what score we know not; which it is feared, if not accommodated, may prove of farther consequence.

Here is at present a discourse again, as if his Excellency might be suddenly recalled from this Government, and some say, that her Majesty hath already made choice of another person to succeed him in it, but of this, we have as yet no great certainty.

*Roma, May 30.* By the Letters from *Lyons*, we have advice, that the Bishop of *Laon* was arrived there on his way hither, where we expect his arrival accordingly in few days; we are told, that Signior *Magalotti* will likewise be here very suddenly, to desire, as is said, leave of his Holiness to raise in the Ecclesiastical Dominions a Regiment for his most Christian Majesties Service.

Signior *Durazzo* designed *Nancio* to the Duke of *Savoie* is come to Town in order to that journey, though some are apt to think him not very forward to undertake the employment, and that he will rather endeavor to excuse himself from it; however, as yet we know nothing declared to the contrary. Yesterday arrived here the Dutchess *Mazarine* from *France*, and hath since received the visits of most of the persons of quality here.

The Pope having been informed of Cardinal *Antonio's* having been somewhat disgusted at the proceeding of the Chamber of Accounts here, who pretending that the Estate of the Count de *Franchipani*, beheaded for Treason at *Nicusa*, was forfeited to the Church, had accordingly sent several persons to take possession of it, to the exclusion of his Eminency, who by a settlement made by the said Count, claims the Marquisate of *Nemi* part of that Estate, hath been much displeas'd with the proceedings of his Ministers, and commanded all possible satisfaction to be given his Eminency in the matter.

It is said, that Cardinal *Altieri* seems much dissatisfied at the Spanish Ambassadors having refused to receive and treat the Duke de *Gravina*, at a visit he made his Excellency, in quality of the Popes Nephew; which hath given occasion to the rest of the publick Ministers here, to declare that they must expect directions from their Masters, before they can receive him, otherwise than the Spanish Am-

bassador hath done, having written to the Court at *Madrid*, to acquaint them with his proceedings herein; upon the return of those Letters we expect to see how the matter will be determined.

*Dantzick, May 30.* Our last Letters from *Watz* saw tell us, that the King receiving daily fresh alarms from the *Cossacks* in the *Ukrain*, had appointed the 13th of the next Month, for the general Rendezvous of all the Militia of the Kingdom at *Leopol*, and that his Majesty intended himself to begin his journey towards that place the 20th instant: That in the interim he hath nominated Commissioners to treat with *Dorofensko* General of the *Cossacks*, intending to try first, what effect those milder ways may have, before he make use of any force to bring them to their obedience.

On the 12th instant is appointed to be held a General Dyet, the main matter to be there consulted on; is, as is said, the raising of Money for the payment of the Army.

*Leghorn, June 1.* This morning Sir *John Finch*, late Resident from His Majesty of Great Britain with the Great Duke, departed from hence by *Folucca* for *Genoua*, in order to his return for *England*, by the way of *Turin* and *France*. We have lately advice here, that in and about the City of *Grand Cair*, there are within these few Months 60000 persons dead of the Plague.

At *Florence* hath been celebrated the Birth of the young Prince, with Feastings and all kind of publick rejoycings.

*Venice, June 5.* From *Naples* we are told, that the discourse there is, that the Duke of *Ferrandina* hath at length obtained that Government; *Don Pedro d' Aragon* the present Vice-Roy being recalled home.

The Gallies of *Malta*, have, it is said, lately taken two Turkish Caravels more on the Coast of *Sicily*, though with the loss of 20 Knights of that Order, and near 200 Seamen and Souldiers, besides other considerable damage they received in the Rencounter.

*Ditto*, Our last Letters from *Dalmatia* bring us the confirmation of the present quiet and peaceable condition of things there on the confines, to the great satisfaction of the Republick; so that we now begin to promise our selves that a short time will determine all those matters that have been so long depending between the Port and this State.

The Marquis de *St. Andre Monchranis* preparing for his journey to *France*. The Captain *Bassa* continues still with his Fleet, consisting, as was said, of about 50 or 60 Gallies, and 120 *Londraes*, about *Candia*, and leaves us still in the dark, as to the design they may be employed upon this Summer. Signior *Harmeda* General of this State, is lately made Governor of *Corfu*, for which place he may very speedily begin his journey accordingly; in the mean time General *Barbaro* is recalled home, with directions to put all things there into the hands of Procurator *Nani*, at present at *Spalatro*. From *Constantinople* we hear nothing more, but that the Grand Signior holds his resolution of going with an Army to *Belgrade*, to hunt there, as is pretended, this season.
