THE BRENT (FREE PERMIT PARKING PLACES) (DISABLED PERSONS) (NO. 1) ORDER 2007

THE BRENT (FREE PARKING PLACES) (DISABLED PERSONS) (REVOCATION NO. 1) ORDER 2007

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Brent on 4 June 2007 made the above mentioned Orders under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), as amended by section 8 of and Part 1 of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985.

2. The general effect of the above 'Free Permit Parking Places' Order will be to:

- (a) re-designate existing free parking places for vehicles displaying a disabled person's badge (commonly referred to as "the Blue Badge") in the streets specified in the Schedule to this Notice to free personalised parking places for vehicles displaying a Brent issued personalised disabled persons parking places permit issued under the Order;
- (b) provide that the parking places will operate "at any time";
- (c) provide that a permit may be issued by the Council on application being made by a disabled person in possession of a Brent issued blue badge and:
 - (i) in receipt of the Disability Living Allowance with the higher rate of mobility component for an indefinite period; or
 - (ii) in receipt of the higher rate of Attendance Allowance for applicants aged 65 or over; or
 - (iii) where the applicant does not drive and has appointed a nominated carer to drive for them, the carer is in receipt of the Carer's Allowance award.

3. The general effect of the 'Revocation' Order will be to revoke the existing disabled persons parking places specified in the Schedule to this Notice provided by the Brent (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) (No. 2) Order 1994 and the Brent (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) (No. 1) Order 2001.

4. A copy of each of the Orders, which will come into operation for the purposes of the placing of traffic signs on 15 June 2007 and for all other purposes on 18 June 2007 and of maps which indicate each length of road to which the Order relates can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the end of six weeks from the date on which the Order were made at:-

- (a) The One Stop Local Office, Brent Town Hall, Forty Lane, Wembley, Middx, HA9 9HX; and
- (b) The One Stop Local Office, Brent House, 349-357 High Road, Wembley, Middx, HA9 6BZ.

5. Copies of the Orders may be purchased from the address mentioned in paragraph 5(b) above.

6. Any person desiring to question the validity of either of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to either of the Orders may, within six weeks of the date on which the Orders were made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

GRANGE ROAD, WILLESDEN

THE BRENT (PRESCRIBED ROUTES) (NO.) TRAFFIC ORDER 200

1. NOTICE IS GIVEN that the Council of the London Borough of Brent propose to make the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by section 8 of and Part 1 of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985.

2. The general effect of the 'Prescribed Routes' Order would be to prohibit vehicles from entering that length of Grange Road from a point 30.00 metres north-west of the north-western kerb-line of Cornwall Gardens north-westward to its north-westernmost extremity.

3. The prohibition referred to in paragraph 2 above would not apply to:-

- (a) pedal cycles, or
- (b) vehicles when used in the service of the Council of the London Borough of Brent in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or the performance of such duties for the vehicles to enter the prohibited area; or
- (c) vehicles being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement, reconstruction, cleansing or lighting of the prohibited street or the laying, erection, alteration or repair of any sewer thereunder or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any electronic communications network or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign thereon; or
- (d) vehicles being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes in an emergency; or
- (e) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform; or
- (f) any person who causes any vehicle to proceed in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Police.

4. A copy of the proposed Order, of a map of the relevant area and of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the expiration of a period of 21 days from the date on which this Notice is published at:-

THE CROYDON (FREE PARKING PLACES) (DISABLED PERSONS) (NO. 4) TRAFFIC ORDER 2007

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Croydon Council on 4 June 2007 made the above-mentioned Traffic Order under Sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985 and the Road Traffic Act 1991.

2. The general effect of the Croydon (Free Parking Places) (Disabled Persons) (No. 4) Traffic Order 2007 would be to:

- (a) revoke the disabled parking places outside Nos. 32 and 34 Addison Road, South Norwood, (reverting back to a 'pay and display' bay), outside No. 7 Beaumont Road, Upper Norwood, outside No. 25 Belmont Road, South Norwood, outside No. 57 Dalmally Road, Croydon, outside No. 87 Frant Road, Thornton Heath, outside No. 6 Gilsland Road, Thornton Heath, (reverting back to a 'pay and display' bay), outside No. 59 Lancing Road, Croydon, outside No. 55 and outside No. 69
