Naples, March 1.

E have had no News from Trapani fince the 11th of February, N. S. But as the Winds have been, it is not doubted the Convoy from Melazzo with the Troops is got to Trapani. The Lenox and Grafton, British Men of War, failed Yesterday for Port Mahon.

Berne, March 21. The Secretary which came hither lately from Zurich with a Project for regulating the Affair of Mulheim, and to which the faid Ganton defired the Concurrence of this State, is ftill here, notwithftanding the Answer he received feveral Days ago to his Requeft, and which tends to exhort the forenamed Canton to come to an Agreement with that of Glaris, which appeared to have an equal Right to the Nomination of a Curate at Mulheim. It feems this Secretary flays here for further Orders from his Masters. The Council eftablished here fome Time ago for Managing the Affairs of Trade and Commerce, and for Encouraging the Erections of feveral Sorts of Manufactures and Fabricks in this Canton, has fent lately for a Merchant from Coire, in the Country of the Grifons, who being faid to be a Man well vers'd in those Matters of Trade, by reason of his Traffick in Italy and Germany, is expected will be able to give fome Light to the Council, with regard to their Defign, and they are in frequent Conference with him.

Paris, March 27, N.S. On the 19th Instant it was declared by an Arrêt, that the Louis d'Ors which were to be reduced the 20th one Eighth of their Value, according to the Arrêt of the 11th, are to continue to be received at the Mints till the End of this Month at the prefent Value, and are only reduced in Pay-ments between Man and Man. Another Arrêt of the fame Date prohibits the Importation of Gold and Silver either in Specie of this or any other Country, or in Ingots, into this Kingdom, upon Pain of Confifcation of the Gold and Silver, and the Ships, Waggons, Coaches, Horfes, or other Carriages on which it shall be found, and a Penalty of 10000 Livres. This Arrêt is to have Effect till the End of December next. It directs likewife, that the Gold and Silver which may be brought in by Ships which may be now returning from long Voyages, shall be deposited in order to be exported, unlefs the Owners shall chuse rather to fell it to the Company. The Company are excepted out of this Arrêt, and are permitted to export or import Gold and Silver either in Specie or in Ingots. Since the first Creation of the Actions by the Company, which were called Actions de la Compagnie d'Occident, the East-India and China Companies having been united to them, and the Company filed La Compagnie des Indes; and by the Arrêr of the jeh Inftant the Submiffions and Primes being called in, and Actions being to be delivered out inftead of them, an Arrêt was published the 12th Instant for
