other Ships would likewise be equipped in 14 Days time. The States have granted a Tax for the immediate Service of the Publick to be paid by the first of May, and they have likewife made a Repartition for recruiting forthwith all the Regiments in the Kingdom both Horse and Foot, fo that it is computed the Army will before the End of April be full 50000 Men. The Danish Minister M. Lewenohrn is hourly expected here from Copenhagen. The select Committee of the States appointed to consider of the Queen's late Proposals for conferring the Regal Dignity on her Confort the Hereditary Prince of Hesse, made Yesterday their Report in writing to the whole Assembly, and Copies thereof were at the same time delivered to each Order of the States to be also confidered of by them, in their respective Houses, and it was unanimously agreed that the Affair should be finally determined on the 18th Instant. Count Gyllenborg is ordered by her Swedish Majesty to go as a fourth Plenipotentiary to the Congress at Brunswick.

Hague, April 9. The States of the Province of Holland being to re-affemble To-Morrow, most of the Deputies are already arrived here, and it is believed they will then come to a final Refolution upon the Taxes which have been To long under their Deliberation. M. Ysselmuyden, a Deputy of the Province of Over-Yssel, is nominated by the States General to go and compliment on their Part the new Bishop of Munster and Paderborn. M. Goes is designed to be sent to Sweden, with the Character of Ambaffadour from this State, to compliment the Prince of Hesse in case he be declared King; and from thence he is to go and reside at the Court of Denmark in

the Quality of Envoy Extraordinary.
